2012 Breeders' Championship Europe & 1st Berlin Cup International Straight Egyptian Arabian Horse Show

Breeders Championship Europe is the new interesting operation on the European show scene. It's Organizing Committee in each of the four show catalogues opening this four-step event wish to create a new legend in Europe, greeting the attendants with the words: "let the legend come to you". Surely this and next year will show if the "legend" will be successfully accepted by European community but so far all the signs foreseen a bright future for this new operation. Being organized by Arabian Horse Organization with the prize money being a tempting prize for the breeders from all over Europe bringing their horses, sometimes from very far to compete into the competition throughout 2012. Besides the money,

importat factor of every serious horse activity the idea of the Championship supports the breeders, either small or big ones as only the horses bred and shown by the same person are allowed to compete in this new Championship. The 12-20-points score system is as much objective and actual as possible leaving only the most appropriate scores with the highest and lowest (1,5 point lower or higher then average) eliminated from the totals, as well as the head, neck, front legs and hind legs being scored separately that gives the more accurancy to the judges in using their evaluations. Also the championship qualifications opens the gate to more then just first and second placed horses in the classes, allowing also 10, 8 or 3 additional highest scored horses from every

age group (depending on the number of horses in the group) to compete in the finals.

All those rules together with probably one of the most amazing showgrounds in Europe of Bon Homme Stud made Berlin Championships one of the most pleasant Arabian horse events this season without a doubt, being judged by international jury panel: Maria Ferraroni (IT), Silvia Garde-Ehlert (DE), Ann Norden (SE), Khalifa Al Foorah (UAE) and James Swaenpoel (BE).

The show venue made a right impression on the events prestige with the beautiful dressage breeding and events

center, beautiful barns, two indoor arenas, own hotel and restaurant, great facilities for people and horses and breathtaking views on the hilly pastures and park around. Also helpful and nice staff from the organizing team and the center itself should not be left without a mention.

All those factors surely made the international group of around 40 different top as well as beginning breeders and some well known show trainers enjoying the weekend of 30 June-1 July.

The junior fillies classes started with a high quality kick out in the yearlings when the already entitled with 3 gold medals

this season (West Coast Cup, Tulip Cup and Arabic Frankfurt) exotic daughter of Marajj – My Fair Rose-D bred by Dion Arabians, Belgium distanced all her rivals with the total score of 91,70. The fillies placed second and third were placed close to each other – Zamzam Al Muawd by Psytadel (90,60), Gold Champion this year at North West Group Show already, and her stud mate Mistrill Al Muawd by Abha Qatar (90,30), second placed this year at Al Khalediah Festival, both bred and owned by Ryan Jones and Mohamed Al Subaie, UK. Although the class of 3 years old fillies presented the outstanding quality with top three horses scored above 90 points with the winner - Isadora Joy, a tall and exotic Magnum Psyche daughter (scored 91,40) bred by

Anne Joye, Belgium, no junior filly reached the score of My Fair Rose-D who took her fourth Gold medal this season in the finals. Silver went to Isadora Joy and Bronze – to another 3 years old filly Jumanah-D by WH Justice, brought by Dion Arabians, scored the same total score as Isadora Joy in the class. Top Five of junior fillies championship that qualified to the final Breeders' Championship at Deauville in October were Mistrill Al Muawd mentioned above and Pyronia KA by QR Marc bred by Knocke Arabians, Belgium, placed 4th in the class of yearlings.

The colts section was opened with 6 entries with 3 of them coming from neighbouring Poland. This year Berlin show

was very popular amongst Polish breeders who brought large group of horses all ages and very good in quality, belonging to as many as 11 different private Polish stud farms. In the class the top places went to Italy, UK and Austria with unquestionable winner – very interesting grey Gazal Al Shaqab son – Dante bred by Emilio Capacci. Although Dante's score 90,20 was lower than the total of 90,50 gained by the most successful 3 years old colt Juwel OS (by WH Justice) it was Dante who did the best performance in finals and took Gold medal in front of Sabea Al Muawd (by WH Justice) owned by Al Muawd Stud, second placed in the yearlings and awarded Silver, DA El Amino by El Amin bred by Cornelia Kolnberger, third in the yearlings

and Bronze in finals. Junior Male Top Five was completed with the highest scored yearling – Juwel OS and Juss Perlito by Aja Justified, the highest scored 2 years old colt bred by Manuela Kusel from Germany. Senior mares section opened with class 4-6 years old had only 2 contenders but it was one of the highest scored classes of the show. The total for Chaos Persefona by Poganin, bred by Chrcynno-Palace Stud from Poland with 20-ties for type and movements was 92,13 and she seemed to be unbeaten for long however the second placed in this section, a lovely WH Justice daughter bred by Sax Arabians – Naha was also appreciated by the judges with total of 90,60. But it was the class of eldest mares 7 years and older a real clue of the show with 4 entries, all

grey, correct and feminine, all scored over 90 points. Here the class winner happened to be the further most successful horse of the show. It was Farhanah Bint Navarrone by Ansata Selman bred by Dion Arabians, Gold Champion Mare at Arabica Frankfurt show this year. Scored with all 20 for type and another 6 more for head and neck and movements gave her the total of 93,20 that was the highest score of the whole show that brought to Farhanah Best Female of the Show, Best in Show and the special trophy for the Highest Scored Horse of the Show sponsored by Sh. Khaled Bin Laden of Rabab Stud, Egypt. Her breeder – Dion Arabians happened also the Best Breeder of the show. Silver Champion in that tough battle was Polish bred Chaos

Persefona from Chrcynno-Palace Stud and Bronze – Italian Fannina by Wahid bred by Salvatore Cuccia, the 3rd placed in the eldest mares group. Top Five of the finals of senior mares was deservedly completed by Naha (by WH Justice) and very correct, dapple grey Simeon Sadik daughter HS Cinderella bred by Halsdon Arabians, UK. Although two classes of senior stallions gathered only 6 entries in two classes the total scores of all stallions shown great quality again, five of them were scored over 90 points. Probably the most cheered horse of the show was the winner of the class 4-6 years old, darkbay El Mariachi by Excalibur (90,70) bred by Nadja Brennicke from Germany. He won against such entitled stallions as several championships winner

including Bronze Champion at Deauville 2011 – exotic Elmaran (by Al Maraam) from Poland and famous showman and great mover Marshan (by Meshan Ibn Kubinec) from Sax Arabians. Also great moving El Mariachi was a real "dark horse" of the show winning Gold medal in front of the beautiful show veteran from Sax Arabians – Al Milan (by Al Lahab) taking Silver and Shakar Ibn Sanadiva by Kubinec bred by Ralf Heckenbucker taking Bronze medal. Top Five of Senior Stallion Championships was completed by Elmaran and Marshan and at the end of the day, expectedly, El Mariachi became the Best Male of the show making his young breeder probably the most excited person of the show. The special Trophies being already a tradition of Breeders'

Championship Europe was the award for the best sire of the show that added the next cup to the long list of best sire titles to WH Justice and the Beat Handler of the Show with the 5000 Euro cheque this time stayed in Germany – with Frank Spoenle.

The lovely Saturday afternoon ended up with charming barbecue in the gardens of Bon Homme.

It was a great end of the Breeders' Championship and beginning to the 1st Berlin Cup – the competition of some of the best quality Straight Egyptian horses in Europe.

The idea of this new event arose from the thought of several regional German breeders of Straight Egyptian Arabian horses to popularize the breed amongst the people of Berlin, one of the biggest European capital cities. But it seems that the regional idea, managed by Heike and Manfred Hein, worldwide known successful breeders of Straight Egyptians, quickly developed into the great international event with the bright future and famous sponsors supporting it as: Al Shaqab, Hamadi Stud, Bon Homme Stud, Bait Al Arab from Kuwait and Al Zobair Stud, UAE. The quality of horses entering the arena class by class this Sunday afternoon was just breathtaking. The show was opened with lovely section of foal championships, by the

greatly conformed and good moving grey Bourhani Halawa (by Bourhani Montashar) bred and owned by Bourhani Arabians, who went Silver Champion Foal. The Gold Champion and class winner was amazing black filly VA Amavi Bint Valentina A (by TB Yasir) greatly trotting with tail up next to her black dam – Valentina AA by Ali Valentino. Great success of Valentina Arabians of Family Schaab! The highest quality international panel of judges, formed from some most known Straight Egyptian horse breeders: Dr Nasr Marei (EG), Raouf Abbass (EG), Dr Francesco Santoro (IT) and Talal Al Mehri (KW), had a difficult task choosing from excellent quality that began the junior fillies. The winner of the yearlings was a further

Bronze Champion, and owner of one of the most amazing faces of the show- El Thay Mayzouna (by El Thay Mahfouz). She has beaten in the class a very typey Nawader Al Shaqab from Al Shaqab Stud, daughter of US Egyptian Event Champion - Farhoud Al Shaqab. The future Gold Champion Junior Filly was brought already in the next class - where the winner was extremely pretty Amina Al Shaqab by Al Adeed Al Shaqab, who collected four twenties for type and head and neck. As next hours shown, it was great day for Al Shaqab bred and owned offsprings, especially those sired by World, All Nations Cup and US Egyptian Event Champion - Al Adeed Al Shaqab. His another daughter - Yakoutah Al Shaqab was highly scored (110,75) and second placed in 2

years old fillies, beaten only by the further Silver Junior Champion - Rashida Al Zobair (by Alzeer Al Rayyan), bred and owned by Al Zobair Stud, UAE, who was scored 111 points. In the colts every champion came from a different age group. In the yearlings we found a further Bronze medal winner, who won this section. It was Hamadi Moniet Al Masa, sired by another World Champion - Al Lahab, and bred by Hamadi Arabians, DE. The Silver medal winner was the best colt two years old - Set SL, a grandson of Ansata Sinan, bred and owned in Isarael by Lederman & Lezion while the best young colt and the Gold Champion was selected from the eldest group of 3 years old, a greatly conformed and even better moving Nayiel Al Khaled by

Senior mares classes was a real delight to watch being a parade of high quality daughters of famous sires. The 4-6 years old section was won by beautiful grey ESA Naadirah Nile by Ansata Nile Nadir (Ansata Sinan), bred by famous Imperial Stud, USA and owned by Hanaya Arabians in Switzerland, scored with total of 110,50. At the end of the day she became a Silver Champion Senior Mare in front of her class and stud mate, second placed (110,25) and Bronze Champion Noor Magidaa LDA by Mishaal HP, bred by LD Arabians, USA and also owned

by Nayla Hayek's Hanaya Arabians. The unquestionable winner of the mares championship was a triumphant of the eldest group, a beautiful Amirat Al Shaqab, again a daughter of Al Adeed Al Shaqab, who was not only elected Gold Champion but also Best Mare of the Show with the total of 110,75 points. In her age group she has beaten a daughter of famous Simeon Sadik – Hamadi Malika Munia from Hamadi Arabians, DE. Senior stallions competition was impatiently awaited by the breeders looking for possible future high quality Straight Egyptian sires for their breedings. The class of 4-6 years olds brought further Bronze medal winner – Bourhani Monthashar by Simeon Sharav, another successful horse

by Bourhani Arabians, already entitled with medals in the past, not only as a halter horse but also under the saddle. The Silver came from the next class – 7-9 years old stallions with the winner bred in USA and owned in Israel – Hals Moonshadow by Halameer, entered to the show by Ronen Braver. As Straight Egyptian Arabian horses very often became the more beautiful the older they are its not a big surprise that once again the Gold Medal Champion and the Best Male was elected from the eldest seniors – it was great, bay mover, several times champion in the past of his 11 years show career, this

time scored as high as 109,75 - Pyramid Aalin by Ali Valentino, bred and owned by Wagner Family who gained the highest trophies for Senior Stallions this times.

We are very much looking forward that the Breeders Championship Europe will create its legend for a long time and we will meet next year with a great opportunity of seeing some of best Straight Egyptian horses at the accompanying Berlin Cup Internationals again!
