





he EBC Live Stallion Auction is always one of the week's highlights. As this year's auction was scheduled on a lighter class day, energy was high! For the festivities, the arena was converted into a lively auction house with a staging area for the auctioneer & horse presentations.

The auction raised an impressive total of \$197,350--\$22,000 more than in 2011! In 2011, the highest selling breeding went to Laheeb Al Nasser for \$15K. This year, for a record amount, the highest selling breeding sold to the globally loved Thee Desperado for \$21,000 to Ruel and Virginia Gober!












"An Arabian Night in Black and White"





One of the evening's surprises was a lovely gift from the 2012 Gala Sponsor Sheikh Khalid H.A. Gahtani of Salayel, from the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. All Gala attendees received a collection of exquisite prints representing Oriental and Islamic art and architecture during the Mamlouk era. This collection has been reprinted from a rare book in the Salayel Arabian Horse Library.

The Art Auction was a success, as was the entire evening. Last year the highest purchase amount was \$9,500, at which price two seperate pieces were sold. This year, a bronze of "Nazeer" donated by it's creator Karen Kasper, sold for an impressive \$20,000 to Rena Norcross, while a paining by Ali Al Mimar titled "Freedom in Spring", sold for \$15,500 to the DeShazers. In total, the auction raised \$75,7000-\$24,200 more than in 2011!



he 2012 US Egyptian Event was an exciting show! Many of the world's top SE's competed neck-n-neck as the classes were big and the quality deep. In total, 307 horses competed representing countries all over the world.

Because of the huge payoffs, the Egyptian Breeders' Challenge Classes are two of the most competitive and exciting of the show. These are the yearling colts and fillies who are the progeny resulting from breedings won in previous **Egyptian Breeders' Challenge Auctions**. Amongst the winners, the fillies had a jackpot of \$55,795 to divide while the colts shared \$55,715. For the Filly and the Colt Classes, Rock Creek Arabians, home to Arabians LTD and owned by **Judy Sirbasku**, shined the brightest as both winners were progeny of their stallions.

The two major standouts in the Championship classes were sires Al Adeed Al Shaqab (Ansata Halim Shah X Sundar Alisayyah), owned and bred by Al Shaqab Member

Qatar Foundation of Doha, Qatar and Ashhal Al Rayyan (Safir X Ansata Majesta), owned and bred by Sheikh Abdulaziz bin Khalid Al Thani of Al Rayyan in Doha, Qatar. Al Adeed Al Shaqab sired two of the four the Gold Champions, grandsired another Gold Champion and sired one of the Bronze Champions. Ashhal Al Rayyan sired both the Gold and Silver Senior Male Champion Stallions.

Although the show was stacked with highlights, Unanimous Gold Champion Stallion Hadban Al Shaqab, owned & bred by Al Shaqab Member Qatar Foundation and leased by Dr. Joseph (Jody) Cruz of Los Osos CA, deserves special mention as he was this year's only Unanimous Champion. He is also now the second US Egyptian Event Gold Champion Stallion to have been produced by Sundar Alisayyah (Ruminaja Ali X Imperial Sayyah). Since the US Egyptian Event in Lexington, Hadban Al Shaqab has also become the US Region 2 Supreme Champion Stallion.
