Championships



This year brings many changes to the show rules in Europe, that also concerned this most important - Title Shows such as World Championships. And so for the first time in Paris yearling fillies and colts competed for separate trophies apart from 2-3 years old colleagues. This idea for more-to-win encouraged breeders to enter even more youngsters to this most prestigious show of the season, so also the excitement for spectators rised up.

Congratulations to ECAHO individuals for the right steps into the future of our show scene!

Traditionally under the patronage of HH Mohammed VI, King of Morocco the 2012 World Championships were attended by almost 160 horses (due to the entries in catalog) representing 24 countries from Europe, Middle East, North America and Australia. The judges panel invited this year gathered well known authorities from 7

Following the changes in age groups, the Friday program of event contained all female qualifying competitions – yearlings, juniors and seniors. As usually,

due to many entries age groups were also divided into sections A and B, each age group having a patron and each section having two sponsors; of the section and of The Best Head winner. Also The finals – championships had a patron and sponsor each, so it was really a parade of trophies! Opening section A of yearling fillies, runned under the patronage of Al Shahanian Stud and sponsored by Knocke Arabians was a beginning of good luck of Al Shaqab team at this World Championships. Fai Al Shaqab, by the still leading sire around the world – Marwan al Shaqab and out of RSD Dark Victory daughter Victoria II who probably had her impact into the impressive coat color of this filly, already won the titles of Scottsdale International Bronze Champion and ABWC Las Vegas Top Ten Supreme Champion before. She ended the European show season with the great result of World Championships Silver Medal on Sunday afternoon in the Yearling Fillies Championships

sponsored by Al Jalawiyah Stud and under the patronage of Al Shahania Stud! Just for 0,5 points she had beaten Aja Europa from Aja Arabians (by debuting as a sire – Triplecrowned Aja Justified and out of Marwan Al Shaqab mare), who found her place as second in the class and in Top Ten in Sunday finals. Its not a big secret that head shape is still one of the most fashionable point in Arabian horse look, setting the standarts on the show rings nowadays. And so since few years every section of

World Championships has its „La Plus Belle Tete“ (Best Head) trophy to honour those statue-like beautiful creatures. The winner of Best Head in section A yearling fillies sponsored by Atyab Stud was also Aja Europa.

The biggest winner of yearling females section as well as bronze champion came out of the section B, sponsored by Al Shaqab Stud, where the highest total score for yearling fillies (551,5) appeared. It was for Ghanadir Al

Zobair (by MCA Magnum Gold), owner of one of most incredible necks of the show and not only necks as she was also given The Best Head trophy of that section, sponsored by Royal Cavalry of Oman. This filly owned by Al Zobair Stud UAE and prepared by Tom Schoukens was already Bronze medal winner at prestigious Mediterranean Championships in Menton the same year. She also went almost unanimously (6 out of 8 judges votes) a Gold Champion of 2012 World Championships,

in front of her section mate – AJ Asyad (scored 551, by Marwan Al Shaqab out of WH Justice daughter Aja Angelica) bred and owned by HRH Prince Ammar Bin Humaid Al Nuaimi, Ajman Stud. Big change of the order in the leading yearlings competing around Europe in this case as it was AJ Asyad who recently won Gold Medals at Mediterranean Championships in Menton and All Nations Cup in Aachen. Well, shows the lottery of many factors, also good luck!

The classes of fillies 2-3 years old (as well as their championships later on) were runned under the patronage of Al Khalediah Stables - and this decision certainly brought also good luck to the stud of HRH Prince Khaled Bin Sultan Bin Abdul Aziz Al Saud. Al Khalediah Stables with its Ghazalat Al Khalediah (by PA Gazsi, bred by Panonnia Arabians, US) was unquestionable winner of section A (sponsored by Al

Baydaa Stud Egypt). Ghazalat, presented as usually for Al Khalediah by Philippe Hosay collected already all colors of medals in 2011 with gold medal from Menton, Bronze at All Nations Cup and Silver at World Championships. This year she ended the finals with the bronze medal junior fillies championship after a very tough battle sponsored by Al Khaled Farm! Her class mate, placed second with one point less (552) was UL Sid Parma by El Sid bred in Denmark and owned still in this country by Ulrichsdal

Arabians. This cute chestnut of huge eyes and pretty ciselled head has several trophies won in Europe on the account and her biggest life achievement is now silver medal junior fillies in Paris. What a success of not a big breeding farm against world leaders! The winner of the Best Head Trophy sponsored this time by Dubai Stud stay in France – for HG Sweet Fantasy (by Psyasic) bred by Peter Birch (DK) and owned by Flavie Allman, presented by Scott Allman.

Even more exciting was the section B sponsored by Hanaya Stud, where the highest total score of all junior fillies was given. It was for the first, but not the last great triumphant of 2012 World Championships coming from Poland - current 2012 European Junior Champion Wieża Mocy (by QR Marc out of Ekstern daughter) bred and owned by famous Michałow Stud, home of several former world champions. Scored as high as 558 she left far behind such great class mates as AV Dalia (by Ajman

Moniscione) from Italy scored 553,5, and AJ Siyadah by Vervaldee – one of the flag youngsters of Ajman Stud, Bronze Champion from Sharjah and Abu Dhabi International Shows last year, owner of one of most exotic heads to be seen at showrings nowadays. This 2 years old filly very well prepared by Frank Spoenle was unquestionable winner of Best Head Trophy of this section, presented by Al Mohamadia Stud.

It's worth to mention that judging Junior Female Championships this year pushed the jury panel to the heights of their knowledge as the quality of all qualified fillies was really outstanding. The proof of how tough task the judges had was the fact that the gold medal was presented to beautiful Wieża Mocy from Poland although this filly gained just 4 out of 8 judges votes for gold medal. The rest of the votes for gold were split between three different females – with silver medal to UL Sid

Parma (2 votes for gold medal and 2 for silver) and bronze to Ghazalat Al Khalediah (1 vote for gold, 1 for silver and 2 for bronze) but also AJ Siyadah finally honoured amongst Top Ten had also 3 votes for silver medal (and 1 for bronze)!

show leaders, the seniors, are the real battle of beauty against fame of past life results. Since many years kind of competition for itself in senior mares is „Poland vs the rest of the world” as indeed beautiful and typey grey Polish mares have usually been leaders of top European shows since years, also in Paris. And the story seems to repeat over and over again, this year under patronage (of this group and senior championships) of Athbah Stud.

Although in the section A (sponsored by De Dartherey Arabians), first two highest scored were from Dubai and Australia – FT Shaella (by Shael Dream Desert) returning to the ring from Dubai Stud (with 560,5) and Aja Aphrodite (by WH Justice) from Mystica Arabians, with 555 points, it were 2 other fillies from Poland who completed the qualifying places for the Sunday championships from that section. In section B sponsored by Knocke Arabians Polish mares left just 2 places out

of qualifying 6 for other countries. The class winner in fantastic style was the current 2012 European Champion Mare – Pinga (by Gazal Al Shaqab out of Ekstern mare) bred and owned by Janow Podlaski Stud. The mare although heavy in foal presented great disposition and 100% of floating movements that combined with correctness of conformation gave her the score of 565 points, that remained unbeaten until the end of the show and brought her also the trophy for The Highest Scored

Female. Second placed was her country-mate on lease to Athbah Stud – El Dorada by Sanadik El Shaklan, bred by Michalow Stud. She was already twice Polish National and European Champion, US National and All Nations Cup Champion, and she was winning silver and bronze medals in Paris. This time with Glenn Schoukens she was ready for gold... In the championships qualified top six there were also two other Polish bred mares – Palmeta bred and owned by Janow Podlaski and

Etnologia sold from the same farm to Halsdon Arabians. In the further senior mares finals sponsored by Al Zobair Stud amongst the Top Ten we saw 10 beauties, 8 greys and 2 coloured, 6 born in Poland, all of them entitled. Who will win the gold was not an easy answer... but this time the judges made an almost unanimous decision. Five out of eight votes went to... Poland, but not for awaiting her turn, fantastic prepared El Dorada but to Pinga, who also got the trophy for the Best Moving

Mare. Now she deserves to rest and deliver her 2013 baby to come soon!

Silver went to Paris veteran FT Shaella who added the only color of medal she lacked from Paris to her career, as she won gold and bronze as a junior already. Highly awaiting for gold El Dorada with 3 votes for silver and 3 for bronze got back to Athbah Stud with „just bronze” but the quality of that competition was so high that the

reason for silver and bronze was just because there are no 3 gold medals to be given.

Best Head trophies in the senior mares were won as follow – by FT Shaella in section A sponsored by Knocke Arabians, and again – to Polish Pinga in section B sponsored by Salayel Arabians, Saudi Arabia.

Colts is always a tempting part to all spectators as it is the first such prestigious promotion for future multiple champions and popular sires. This year in the yearling males held on Saturday, under patronage of Al Nayfat Stud, there were a few high hopes for gold medals amongst the horses entered, unfortunately – again, the gold is just one!

Section A sponsored by Jarvis Insurance was won by Sultan Al Zobara - very successful cross of Gazal Al Shaqab with the Straight Egyptian mare Inra Al Shaqab. This delicate and refined darkbay colt representing Al Shaqab Stud was bred by Al Zobara Stud both from Qatar and presented by Giacomo Capacci. He put the level of the total scores very high with his 553,5 that was not only unbeaten in any yearling colts sections but it also made him a favorite for the gold medal on Sunday

afternoon in the competition under patronage of Al Nayfat Stud and sponsored by Albidayer Stud. And he got is almost unanimously with 6 out of 8 judges votes possible! Two votes for gold but finally decorated with silver medal got Ascot DD (by Glorious Apal), very exotic and correct colt bred by DD Arabians in Belgium and owned by Athbah Stud, winner of section B yearling colts sponsored by Knocke Arabians. Bronze medal this time went to very strongly supported (again audible and

visible cheerleaders on the tribunes) – AJ Mardan, another great cross by Vervaldee bred at Ajman Stud and prepared by Frank Spoenle. He got already two gold titles in Europe, Germany in 2012 – in Stroehen and at All Nations Cup and in the points he was scored the same as Ascot DD but in championships Ascott collected more votes this time and there can't be two silver medals as well! A significant moment during this championships belonged also to Czech Republic who had it

representative – Gzavi (by Aja Jutified) placed 3rd in section B and awarded Top Ten Championships trophy. It is the first such high title given at World Championships for the horse representing Czech Republic so we owe special congratulations to its owner – Suweco Stud. The Best Head trophies in yearling colts sponsored by Al Shahania Stud and Tutto Arabi with Al Jandal Stud were given to Sultan Al Zobara and AJ Mardan.

Patron of junior males sections (and championships) was Al Khalediah Stables who also put his strong competitor for medals in one of these classes. The group A sponsored by Al Mohamadia Stud was led again by the Al Shaqab team having probably the biggest group of cheerleaders at the tribunes in the championships day this year! So the support was incredible when the unquestionable winner of section A - Wadee Al Shaqab

(by Marwan Al Shaqab out of Mishaal daughter) appeared to the arena to compete for gold during the championships sponsored by Al Jassimya Farm. He could be almost sure that he is the best – his total score of 558 points was the highest total of all the males both juniors and seniors and just one horse – gold yearling filly Wieża Mocy had exactly the same evaluation. The verdict just couldn't be different – and Wadee, gold awarded also at Qatar Internationals and Menton show

this year, grabbed another gold almost unanimously! Only one horse got different vote for gold medal – it was the direct competitor to Wadee in his section, placed there as second (with total of 555,5) – Polish bred and owned Equator (by QR Marc out of Ekstern daughter) from Michalów State Stud, current Polish National Jr Champion and Bronze medalist from 2012 All Nations Cup. The couple Equator and his handler - well known from Paris show rings through the years Mariusz

Liškiewicz were so pleasant to watch while flying around the arena. This lucky flight put them to the silver medal place while bronze went to the patron of that age group – Al Khalediah Stables with its Fakhr Al Khalediah sired by another famous mover and 2011 World Champion – Marquis CAHR. Owners of best heads in junior colts awarded with special trophies were: Van Gogh AM (by Magnum Psyche, bred by Sally Bedeker and owned by Am Mohamadia Stud), indeed probably the most dishy

One of them was Triplecrowned winner in All Nations Cup, European Championships and in Paris – Abha Qatar (by Marwan Al Shaqab) bred by Yeguada Ses Planes and owned by Al Mohamadia Stud. He was one of the big favorites in the section A sponsored by Al Shaqab Stud and for long time with the high total of 557 he was indeed leading the class. Until the time when another big come back entered the arena. More famous as a

This year with new trainer – Paolo Capecci and with cooperation of Dubai Arabian Stud that supported his owner he came back expecting the gold and his great disposition gave him the class win in the section A with 563 points in front of Abha Qatar! In

another section B, sponsored by Asayel Stud, the flag competitor and – expectedly – the winner was former World Champion and Reserve, as well as US National and several times Middle Eastern and across Europe Champion – Dakharo (by Dakar El Jamaal) from Al Khalediah Stables. On the second place in such great company was placed Al Khatab Al Thani (by Al Batran) bred and owned by Al Sawary Stud from Saudi Arabia and prepared by Tom Oben also for his previous bronze

When the emotions before senior stallions championships raised up to enormous, the new casting happened and changed everyone's eventual provisions! Since 2012 World Championships is hosting another new, special trophy called Platinum Medal, this year sponsored by Al Shahania Stud, to be presented to the highest scored senior horse of the show who is already a former World Champion entitled. And so this year a

„champion of senior champions” - Platinum Medal winner was Dakharo! The joy of Saudi Arabian breeders, not only from Al Khalediah took several minutes on the arena with flag parades and public celebrations. It was also finally announced that it is the last show appearance of Dakharo, who won everything he had to win – Platinum Medal seemed like to be just made for him this year... Of course the platinum color excluded him from further medals battle so the question

still remained - will the gold go again to former World Champion Abha Qatar or maybe QR Marc will finally get the dream of his owners? And in 2012 Paris happened to be a place for dreams coming true...unanimously- for all fans of QR Marc armed with caps, flags, clappers, scarfs! Congratulations to all who made all efforts to support this beautiful stallion and successful as sire already. Silver, almost unanimously (with one vote for different horse) went this time to Abha Qatar, who had his big day 3 years

before in Paris when he reigned European show scene with Triple Crown. Bronze medal went to Al Khatab Al Thani - with one vote for silver. That is the most important trophy of this stallion so far so his breeders and owners in one - Al Sawary Farm also went from Paris satisfied... At last but not least the most beautiful head winners in senior stallions were again the biggest triumphant: QR Marc (sponsored by El Farida Stud) and Dakharo (sponsored by Al Shahania Stud).

To make the Sunday championship day even more delightful for all participants, in between the medal competitions, organizers and sponsors presented several other special trophies. And so Trophy Espoir for the junior horse selected by its sponsor (Al Khalediah Stables) went to Barzan Al Shahania (by Stival) - undefeated recently at the US showings being US National Junior Champion in 2011 and twice Breeders World Cup Las Vegas Supreme Champion in 2011 and 2012. Best Movements sponsored by Al Nayfat Stud went this time to Poland for female – Pinga, and male – Palatino (by Pesal) both from Janów Podlaski Stud. The same Polish Stud was also honored by the Sponsor – Al Shaqab Stud, as the Best Breeder and Owner of the competing horses. In turn Al Shaqab became the Best Stud (the biggest number of points collected by horses placed 1-4 in the classes). Al Shaqab representatives
