On the 27th and 28th of August the National championships for Arabian horses in Holland were held at the 'Federatie Centrum' in Ermelo. A beautiful fully equipped location situated in national park 'de veluwe'. A nature park of 74.000 m2 of forest and meadows.

57 horses were entered for the in hand show classes. Despite this low number of entries, the organisation still determined to spread the show into two days, which resulted in quite some complaints from the owners and trainers.

The show started with the colt foal classes. Won by Forelocks Yucatan (Psytdadel x Yarra) – bred and owned by Forelocks Arabians, resulting automatically in a golden medal.

Second in this class and silver medal winner was Eroyal T (AV Montoya x Rigona) – bred and owned by the Van Duijvenbode family.

Third and bronze medal with the same number of points was PocelloKossack (HK Marcello x Poliana) – bred and owned by The Kossack Stud.

The show continued with the filly foals. Won by the big moving Ero'sRomantique (Marhaabah x Raville P) – Bred and owned by the Van Duijvenbode family. This filly automatically achieved the golden medal. She also won the overall foal championship.

Second in this class and silver medal winner was Forelocks Yoli (Kais x Yody) with her sister Forelocks Lunette (Kais x La

Belle) earning the Bronze medal. Both bred and owned by Forelocks Arabians.

The show continued with the ridden classes. Overall champion was AR Sivmayall-D (Sivmen B x Zolita) – ridden by his owner IlonaBax.

Next to go were the mares 4-9 years old. Won by Peppi (Pilgrim x Pritcha) – bred by the Tersk Stud from Russian and owned by Forelocks Arabians. In the senior mare championships later that day, Peppi took the silver medel. Second in class and later bronze medal winner was Fysio Arabians Jawhara * (Rih al Tariq x Shatia) – Bred and owned by Fysio Arabians.

The last class of the day was the class of the 10 years and older mares was convincely won by Albania * (Balaton x Artemida) – Bred by Tersk Stud in Russia and in ownership of the Kossack Stud. This mare achieved a gold medal in the final senior mare championship.

2nd place was for Polynia *(Naftalin x Palomna) – also bred by Tersk Stud in Russia and in ownership of Arabian Fantasiae.

On Sunday the show continued with the junior mare classes. The yearling filly class had only 3 participants. Won by A lady of Kossack (WH Justice x AbakanaKossack) – Bred and owned by the Kossack stud, this filly later took the golden medal in the final junior female championships. She was also awarded with the 'Best Dutch bred horse' award. Second in this class and

later bronze medal winner was Yusriyyah (Monarcos DD x Yusra) – Bred by the Royal stables of Jordan and owned by CA van Wengarden.

The 2 years old filly class was also a small class and won by NashakanaKossack (AjaShakakhan x Nereska) – Bred and owned by the Kossack stud. Later in the championships, this filly took the silver medal. Second in this class was Yta Donna F (Psytadel x Yakima) – bred and owned by Forelocks Arabians.

The next class was the one of the 3 yrs old fillies, with also only 3 participants. Winner was AF Verhima (AF Umoyo x Verdira) Bred by Arabian Fantasie and owned by the Lipperd Family from Germany.

2nd in this class was Eregon P (Honors x Raville P) Bred & owned by Monica van Duijvenbode.

Won by the WH Justice son Justilicious (out of Valencia) – bred and owned by Erik en JosjeDorssers, later this colt took the gold medal in the final junior colt championships. Second in the yearlingclass was Daya al Din (Kas Valdes x AF Antha) – bred and owned by the Biesenbeek family.

The class of the 2 year old colts had a very obvious winner, scoring the highest score of the show. This was Perugino (Marajj x Precious) – bred and owned by Klarenbeek Arabians. Later in the championship, this colt surprisingly only took silver. A second place was for ZA Imago (El Ninjo x ZA Cafirah) – Bred and owned by Samantha Fischer.

Next to go were the 3 years old colts. A class with four colts, all scoring very close or even tie with points. Winner was AR Fayyim (Valerio ibn Eternity x Aicha SVA) – bred by Arabian Ranch and owned by Miriam van Heiningen. Later in the final championships, this colt took a bronze medal.

Before moving on to the big boys, the show organizers also made room for a ridden class for western horses. Won by Shadiya (Sivmen B x AF Antha).

Second in this class was the US-bred Amalfi (Padrons Psyche x RD BeyShampane) – full brother to the
