

26th Brazzi Arabian Horse

*With more than 600 Arabian Horses, in halter, performance, jump, barrels and endurance and around 400 exhibitors from South America, United States and Europe, the Brazilian National proved once again to be one of the liveliest shows for the Arabian horse breed. The championship started on Wednesday November 14th in the city of Ribeirão Preto, inland São Paulo State. 5 days later the Brazilians judges Luis Eduardo Moreira Caio and Marcelo Borges, the Americans Mark Owens and Rick Moser and the Egyptian Nasrs Marei completed their task and chose the Brazilian National Champions for 2007 in Halter and Performance. The two National Champions Senior horses came from Aladdin's sire line. By unanimous choice the Champion horse was *Legacy of Fame, National American Champion in 2002. He arrived in South America last year, imported by the Argentinean breeder Gina Pelham and while traveling through Brazil on his way to Argentina had*

92 of his offspring sold – given the size of the Brazilian program that is a considerable number. *Legacy of Fame brings a lineage that is very much to the Brazilian taste: Aladdin on the sire line through Alada Baskin/Legacy of Gold, with Bey Shah on the dam line through Fame VF. All had important showings in American and Canadian Nationals.

With four second places and one third (Nasrs) the Reserve Power World JQ is a remarkable sire that the breeding program at Haras dos Faveiros of Dr. Jairo Queiroz adds to the legacy of the Arabian horse. The first was the extraordinary Don El Chall. Power, only 5 years old, is devising one of the most important campaigns for the Arabian stallions in Brazil. He was National Champion Young Stallion in 2004 and to date he has sired 8 National Champions and Reserve Champions. This year the Brazilians were extremely satisfied with the Jr. Jr. Filly Champion Miss El Power JQ, daughter of Elkada Sahibi by *Sahibi (El Paso)

from the breeding program of Haras dos Faveiros and owned by the American Jeff Sloan; the Jr. Jr. Colt Champion Bahrif MFS (x Bonytha ATA by Don El Chall), bred and shown by Haras Bahamas of Mauricio Sad and the Young Colt Champion, Karim El Power JQ (Kuala Balih JQ by Balih El

*Jamaal). Dr. Jairo is keeping him for himself despite many tempting offers. Power World is the son of Reserve Brazilian National Champion *World Series (Strike x Love Song by Bask) in Noble Illusion JP, a dam with predominant Egyptian bloodline that has in her lines among others, Ibn El Marrekh, Ansata*

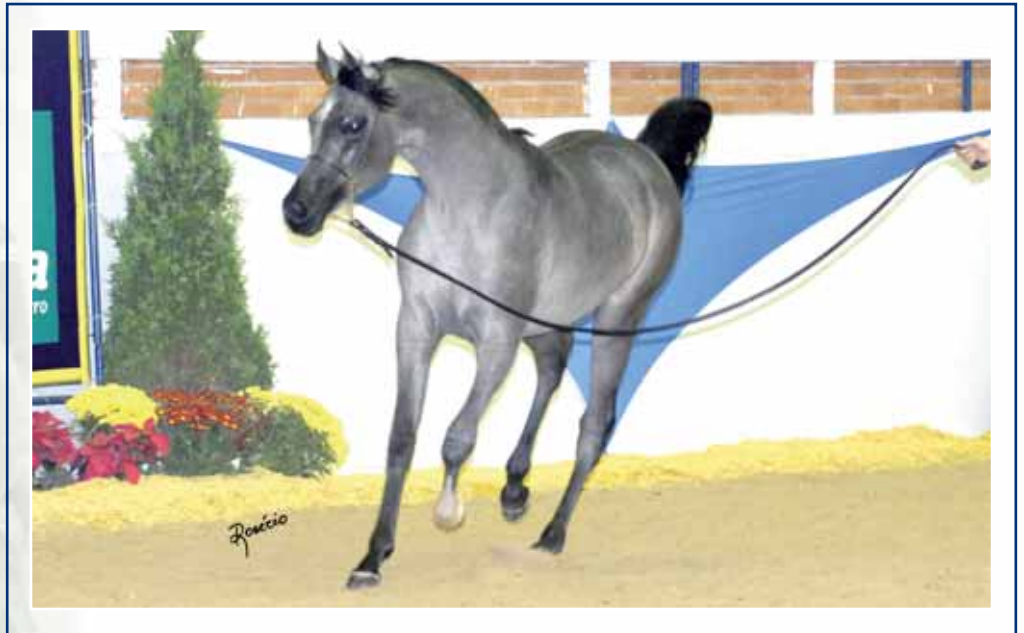

Ibn Halima, Morafic and Shaikh El Badi. Coincidentally the two National Champion Mares also came from the same sire, this time, Bask. The great mare was Miss Prishaza AMR bred by Alaor Ribeiro and owned by Haras As Sahara of Salim Mattar. Miss Prishaza was Reserve National Filly in 2003,

Reserve National Young Mare in 2006, and now National Champion Mare with two first place (Nasr and Owen), two second (Rick and Caio) and a third (Borges). Miss Prishaza descends from Bask on the sire line and Khemosabi in the dam line. Her father Von Herte Pretty Boy died quite young leaving few

*registered offsprings. He was the grandson of the National Champion AF Festival, son of *Basco, one of the four sons of Bask to breed in Brazil. *Khemoshahza, mother of Prishaza, is the daughter of GS Khochise, one of the best sons of the venerable "Khemo" and dam line granddaughter of Ansata Shah Zaman.*

*With one first place (Rick), one second (Borges), two thirds (Caio and Owen) and one fourth (Nasrs), the Reserve Champion Mare went to *Magic Moment, Top Ten American National, imported to Ecuador where she was National Champion and today she belongs to the Argentinean Claudio Cristiani of Haras*

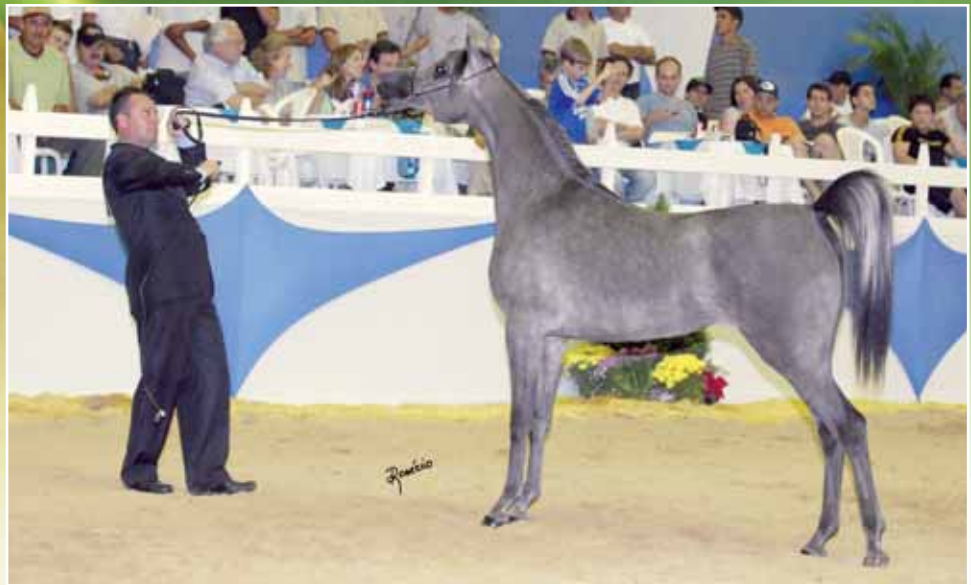

**Ali Jamaal, Padrans Psyche and Bey Shah dominated the final ranking of the Young*

Horse and Young Mare Championship. Bahrein Ali Madan, who was Reserve Jr. Male National Champion in 2005 and Reserve Colt Champion in 2006, was this year's Young Horse Champion, with four first places and one fifth (Nasrs). He was bred by Pedro Amaral of Haras El Madan and shown

*by Haras San Stewan of Sandra Massaro. Bahrein is the son of Ali El Jahd by Jahd El Jamaal. The Reserve, with one first (Nasrs), two seconds (Owen and Caio) and two fourth (Borges and Rick) was *Nikolas Psyche, bred by Robert and Dixie North of North Arabians and imported by Jose and Maisa Alves of*

*Haras JM. *Nikolas is the son of Padrons Psyche. The coincidence of this result is that both champions carried refined dams of the breeding program at Haras Serradinho of JP Martins in its pedigree. Both have El Shaklan in the dam line. Bahrein is the son of Happy Narasha JP (Nadir by Amaal in *Azira El*

*Shavlan by El Shaklan) and the imported Nikolas is the son of the National Champion Opus Rose JP (*Laddin BA x *Rose of Shaklan). In addition to that, the Reserve Champion Horse, Power World JQ, also has a JP as his mother. The Young Mares are descendants of Bey Shah.*

*The Champion Van Toriba with three first (Nasr, Owen, Borges) and two seconds (Caio and Rick), is the daughter of *Style SRA by Bey Shah in Bella Van Ryad by Ryad El Jamaal and the Reserve Hahyrma El Hylan with one first (Caio) three seconds (Borges, Owen, Nasr) and one sixth (Rick) is the dau-*

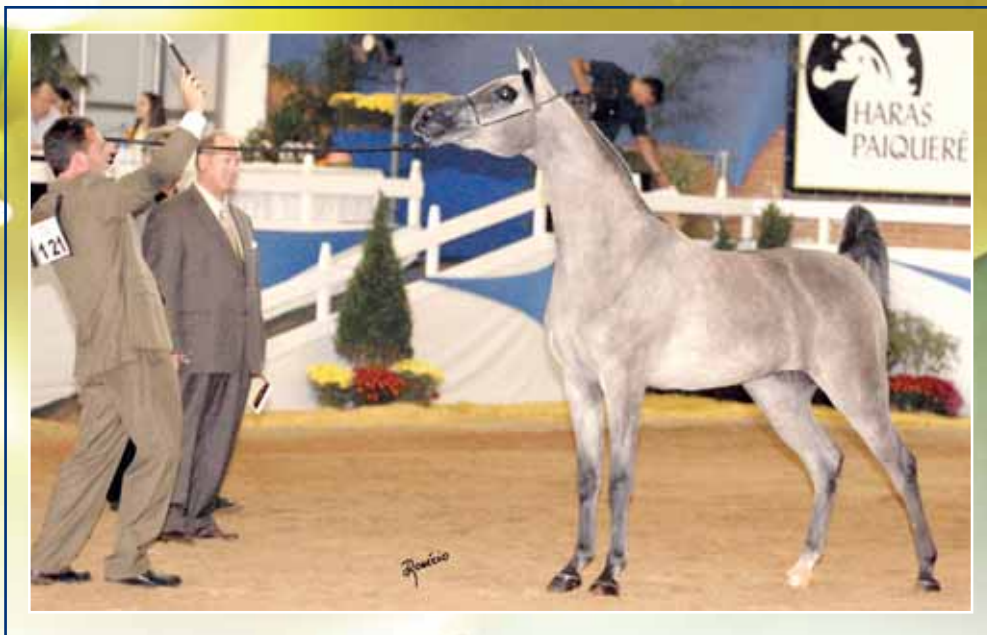

ghter of Hylan by Bey Shah in Hami Vasc by AF Vasco (*Basco). Van Toriba was bred by Haras Vanguarda of Fabio Diniz.

The others champions by this breeder was the unanimously Young Filly Champion Zanella Van Ryad (Ryad El Jamaal x *Striking Rapsody by Strike) and Van Karina, Reserve

Jr. Female. Zanella and Toriba were sold during the show to David Bogg's clients. The Reserve Mare Hahirma is from the breeding program of Haras Engenho of Laudicio and Inez Coelho and belongs to Haras Stigmatas of Carlos and Jackie Menezes, which had won the Breeders' Cup a month earlier, a traditional

and important competition among Brazilians breeders.

The Colts and Fillies as it happened in the last two years, were divided in two championships, one for the youngest, 18 to 26 months, and the other for the older, 27 to 36 months. In this universe, that represents the perspective short

time that there is to select the Brazilians, we had descendents of Marwan Al Shaqab, *Ali Jamaal, Aladdin and Magnum Psyche at the top levels of winnings.

Marwan Al Shaqab had two champions. His son *FA El Shawan was Champion Colt unanimously, and his daughter *Fashionata NA

was Reserve Champion Colt, also unanimously. They will certainly become two very significant representatives of this sire line which is now being introduced to the Brazilian breeding program.

*FA El Shawan, which brings hope to a group of breeders formed by Haras Canaã, Casa Branca, Faveiros, Paineiras and Vila dos

Pinheiros, was already National Jr. Male Champion in 2006. He has in his dam line the blood of El Shaklan, Bey Shah, Kilimandjaro and El Hilal. His sister *Fashionata, albeit born in the United States, has strong ties to Brazil, first because it belongs to the breeding program of Robert and Dixie North, considered great partners of the Brazilians, and

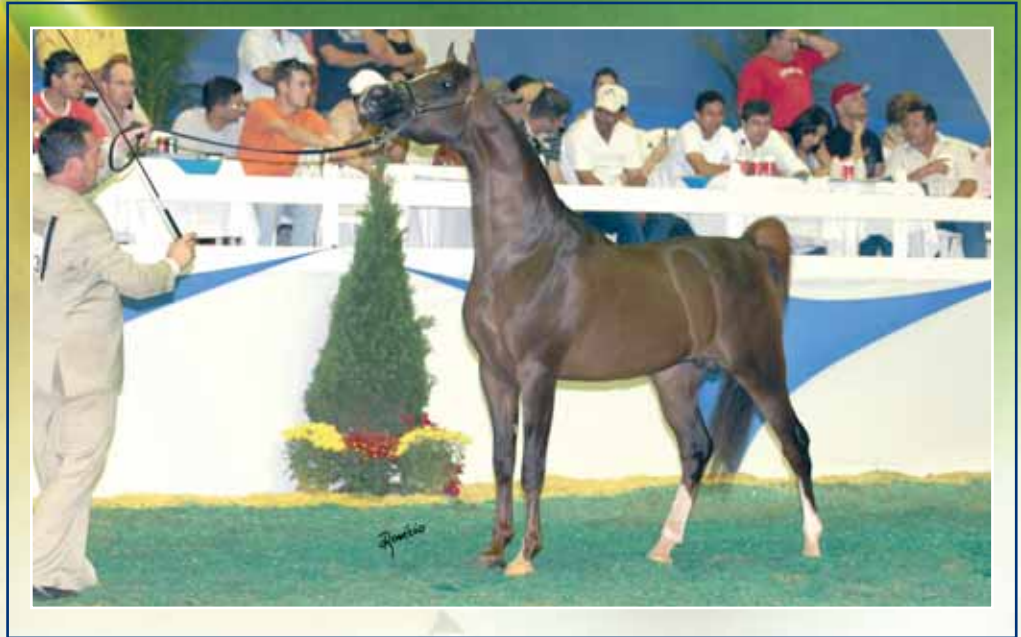

secondly because her dam Hafati Futurista is Brazilian, daughter of the Brazilian National Champion Lumiar Amadeus by RSD Dark Victory. Both were imported by the Norths and re-exported to Shirley Watts of Halsdon Arabians.

**Ali Jamaal, as it has happened in the last 19 years since Miss El Jamaal was Jr. Female*

Champion in 1988, left his registered mark at this National. Three of his grandchildren are National Champions. The Champion Filly Giwa Morab, daughter of Balih El Jamaal and the Champion and Reserve Champion Young Filly, Zanella Van Ryad by Ryad El Jamaal and Berylle El Ludjin.

Giwa, chosen unanimously, was bred by Haras

*Morab of Benedito Morato and belongs to Princess Laetitia D'Areberg of Haras Las Rosas, Uruguay. She was Young Filly Champion in 2006 and has *Ali Jamaal twice in her pedigree: sire line grandfather and dam line great grandfather. Her mother Bint Gypsy is a daughter of Borsalino K in *NV Gypsy*

Wind by Bey Shah. Zanella Van Ryad was Young Filly Champion as we mentioned above and Berylle El Ludjin with three second places (Rick, Caio and Borges) was the Reserve. Berylle is from Lenita Perroy's breeding program at Haras Meia Lua and Bey Shah is her mother's father

**TW Bey Fantaishah. Aladdinn had two descendants among the colts at the National. The Champion Young Colt Karim El Power JQ by Power World JQ as already mentioned above, and ZT Gazzaz deserved second place by all the judges except by Nars Narei. Gazzaz comes from the breeding*

*program of Haras Francajel of Tamer and Ana Izabel Hajel. His father AF Don Giovanni is the son of *Aladd, the first son of Aladdinn to be exported to Brazil. Gazzaz's mother is Lakmmee JM (*Style SRA x Nietzsche El Jamaal). With this title the breeding program of Tamer and Izabel had two Reserve*



Champions at this National, Gazzaz and *Fashionata. The Reserve Champion Colt is twice related to Magnum Psyche: he is grandfather on the sire line and great-grandfather on the dam line of JJ Tehuelche, which obtained three second places (Nasr, Rick and Borges) and one third (Owen). He is the son of the Argentinean National Champion JJ El Bronz and his dam, Magnums Marisa PA by Magnum Psyche, is an American mare with a strong Polish bloodline through Bask that appears twice on her pedigree.

Closing the judging of halters at the 2007 National were colts and fillies, also divided in four separate championships: the Junior-Junior from 6 to 12 months, and Junior from 12 to 18 months. Once again, Aladdin's descendants were the winners as was *Ali Jamaal, Magnum Psyche and Bey Shah. But this time we must add the Hungarian El Nabila B by Kubinec which, even though spending a very short time in Brazil, has left a deep mark on Brazil's breeding program.

Aladdin's offspring includes the already mentioned sons of Power World JQ, Miss El Power and Barirf MFS. From *Ali Jamaal the Male Jr. Champion Henno Serondella (Perseus El Jamaal x Azdar El Jamaal), the Reserve Vektor Bey TGS (Vektor El Ludjin x Vienna Bey TGS by *Shahllenger) and the Reserve Jr. Female Champion Van Karima (Yllan El Jamaal x Dora Van Ryad), all three with great concentration of Jamaal's blood as we can see.

From Magnum Psyche came the Reserve Jr. Jr. Champion Ennya Forx (Magnum Chall x SC Murya by AF Don Giovanni). From Nabila B the Jr. Jr. Female Champion Bruma Bahamas (x *AD Bey Shahna by Bey Shah) and from Bey Shah the Reserve Jr. Jr. Male Champion RFI Farid (RFI Maktub x RFI Fayara El Shiraz).

Henno Serondella was Jr. Male Champion with three first places (Nasr, Caio and Borges), one second (Rick) and one third (Owen). He is from Fabio Amorosino's breeding program of Haras Serondella, where the young Persius El Jamaal, father of Henno, currently resides. Amorosino also

won the title of Reserve Jr. Male Champion, because he is also partner in the Vektor Bey TGS. This colt's history is very interesting and shows how deep the relationships between breeders can become. Vektor was bred by Georges Naoum of Haras TGS and sold to the siblings João and Maria Resende of Haras Lago Oeste, who had fallen in love with the son of Vektor El Ludjin, which already belong to them. They had a relation with Amorosino in Vektor El Ludjin to promote him in the best possible way, but when Amorosino saw the young colt Vektor he couldn't resist and proposed a partnership to the Resendes. As a result, many people ended up sharing Vektor Bey TGS's prize.

The Reserve Jr. Female Van Karima is twice related to *Ali Jamaal. He is in her sire line as grandfather and in her dam line as great-grandfather. This was a further success for Fabio Diniz of Haras Vanguarda at crossbreeding with the daughters of his chief sire Ryad El Jamaal.

One of the most important sons that Magnum Psyche gave Brazil is the National American and Brazilian Champion Magnum Chall HVP. Magnum Chall was exported to the United States but left the Reserve Champion Jr. Jr. Filly Ennya Forx belonging to Leonardo de Castro of Haras Forx. The same happened to his neighbor Mauricio Sad of Haras Bahamas, which took advantage of Nabila B's short stay in Brazil and bred the Jr. Female Champion Bruma Bahamas. After the National, he is going to the United States with her new owner Jeff Sloan.

Another breeder that knows how to shop was the Italian Pippo Palumbo of Aretusa Arabians. Acting rapidly during some of his numerous visits to Brazil, he bought, before the show the Reserve Jr. Jr. Colt Champion RFI Farid and took one of the best example of the greats lineages used in the Brazilians breeding program to Europe. RFI Farid is the son of the RFI Maktub, grandson of the glorious RSD Dark Victory, through Altan Yshmail. RFI Cyntilation, Maktub mother, features the great El

of her pedigree was bred by Haras Santo Antonio da Bela Vista, of the Foz Forte family. He had two first places (Caio and Owen), two second places (Rick and Nasr) and one third (Borges). □
