



Brazilian National

Besides all of its merits, the Brazilian National 2008, which happened in Ribeirão Preto (São Paulo) from November, 12th to 16th, was particularly useful for breeders to evaluate the market in the midst of a strong worldwide economical crisis. It was surprising. While there has been a slight decrease of about 10% in the number of registered horses in halter and performance, there was also a 25% increase in the number of exhibitors, meaning that

the economical moment hasn't shook the breeders' excitement. They were only more selective when deciding which horses to bring to the tracks. The number of foreign visitors has diminished as well and, as a consequence, there was a strong fall in exports, which in that period of the year reached from 30 to 40 animals. But, by contrast, the auction which was done during the event registered an average of US\$ 20,000 for 41 lots, including 32 mares, 1 stud, 1 cover, 6 embryos and a quota relating to a 1/5 of the *FA El Shawan (by Marwan El Shaqab) estate, selling for US\$ 325,000.

There was the usual excitement at the judgment track. The 167 halter horses, judged by Bruce MacCrea (Saudi Arabia), Chris Culbreth and Shannon Armstrong (USA), Leonardo Machado (Brazil), Marianne Tengstedt (Denmark), were divided in 13 championships, with the highest and lowest grade being eliminated and the three remaining being responsible for the awards ceremony.

There were three major highlights on the National: Brazilian breeders Haras Vila dos Pinheiros' Jayme Pinheiro and Haras Quatro Estações' Flávia Torres, and Uruguayan Haras Los Palmares' Carlos Roizner. Jayme Pinheiro is the breeder of 5 National Champions, an unprecedented deed in Brazilian breeding. Flávia Torres exhibited 2 and bred 2 National Champions. Carlos Roizner exhibited 4 Champions.

Laman HVP (Don El Chall x *Padron's Love Song by Padron) has been unanimously established the Champion Stallion Senior. He is well-known in Europe, was exported to Uruguay while still a foal and afterwards Europe. Last year, he returned to Uruguay by Los Palmares' Carlos and Christiane Roizner's doing, with the opportunity of having annual stays in Brazil. The Brazilian breeders celebrate because, due to the recent death of Don El Chall, they see in its foal, Laman, the most important successor from this extraordinary sire line started by the Russian *Prichal (by Aswan). Other two major HVP successes in this National were Champion Young Colt, Ultimate Chall HVP (Magnun Chall HVP x Narwaly HVP by *Cajun Prince) of Haras Quatro Estações' Flávia Torres; Champion Colt Ares HVP (Legacy of Fame x Magnum Rose HVP by Magnum Psyche) exhibited by HVP itself; Reserve Junior Colt Vulcano HVP (Nuzyr HCF x Lady Psyche HVP by Padrons Psyche) exhibited by João Roberto Sorvilos Haras Vale Formoso. And to prove HVP does not produce only good males, Reserve Junior Junior Filly (6 to 10 months) is Talyta HVP (Magnum Psyche x Tamara HVP), full sister of the Brazilian and American National Champion Magnum Chall. Sixteen years into Brazilian breeding, Jayme Pinheiro and his HVP (Haras Vila dos Pinheiros) are systematically contributing to the production quality of Arabian horses in Brazil.

Flávia Torres' Haras Quatro Estações has a lot to celebrate this year. In addition to a thirteen-year-old brand of breeding, it sold at the beginning of the year FT Shaella to Dubai Arabian Stud, which debuted on the International Show Città di Castello 2008, establishing herself as Filly Champion and "Best in Show", and now, at the end of the year, she made 4 National Champions: in addition to Ultimate Chall HVP,

Carlos and Christiane Roizner' Haras Los Palmares showed a surprising strength for someone who is only three years into breeding. In light of excellent imports, they have been bringing to Uruguay an extraordinary team of stallions and mares that will certainly influence the profile of that country's new breeding. In addition to Champion Stallion Laman HVP, the Roizners won the Young Stallion Championship with Justa Magnum

National's Sire Lines

The main Brazilian breeding's sire lines are very obvious in our Nationals results: Aladdinn, *Ali Jamaal and Bey Shah are a fixture of decades with a great amount of winning descendents at each National. However, the surprise in 2008 was the Padron line growth. It is always good to keep in mind that the first Brazilian Nationals, back in the 1980s, used to get a great deal of Padron offspring on the podium. In the early 1990s this lineage started to fade, its influence came back five years ago with the success of Padron's Psyche, then Magnum Psyche and most recently Magnum

Besides the aforementioned, *Justa Magnum and Talyta HVP by Magnum Psyche and Ultimate Chall by Magnum Chall, there is still Junior Junior Colt Champion Kenzo (Enzo x Chiara K by Borsalino K), bred by Ailton Braga's Haras Carol. Reserve Young Mare Champion *Psynsation (Padrons Psyche x Kaiynda Special by Kaiyoun), bred by Richard Dewalt (USA) and exhibited by Pedro Amaral's Haras El Madan; Mag Shall Londrina (Magnum Chall x Wild Orchid TGS by *Shabllenger), bred by Wind Dancer Farm and exhibited by Haras Stigmatas of Carlos and Jackie Menezes's, and Reserve Female Junior Champion Van Sirena (Magnum Psyche x Malika Van Ryad by Ryad El Jamaal), bred by Fábio Diniz's Haras Vanguarda. Sire line of Aladdinn, always very important within Brazilian breeding, had six descendants on this National: Champion Young Filly Victorya FHP (Don El Power JQ x Leticce FHP by Don Giovanni), bred by Haras Paulista, sold to Greg and Jean Jacobs (USA) right af-*
