The EAO Arabian Horse Show was a beautiful exhibition of the Arabian horse. Under the blue sky of Cairo, the most beautiful Arabian horses competed for the prestigious title of EAO Champion.

This show has been under the auspices of and highly honored by the presence of his Excellency Mr. Ameen Abaza, the Minister of Agriculture and with the brilliant attendance of Mr. Esam Abdallah, board President of Emirates Arabian Horse Association and his Excellency, the Minister of Agriculture in UAE, ATHBAH Stud, Al Khalediah and many breeders from Egypt.

The EAO National Championships was another great show with some fantastic results and a celebration of various horse breeds that attracted nearly 3,000 visitors, opens for four days at the seat of over 100 years of tradition in breeding - El Zahraa Stud.

The gates opened daily at 9 A.M. for visitors who want to see the most beautiful Arabians in their morning workouts, and each morning's featured horse show in a grand seat arena behind the grandstand.

Over the course of the four days during which the weather was remarkably cooperative – there were bazaars, boutiques and a V.I.P. tent for mingling.



More than 375 entries were submitted for 12 classes, more than 100 farms but 3,000 people partied, shopped and ate during the course of the show, elevating such activities to near-Olympic sporting events.

This big show with all its efforts and brilliance has resulted in so many distinguished beautiful horses, lets has a look to some of the National and International winners of this great event.

The junior classes at both national and international show were often as huge as 20 entries and the quantity was followed by quality. The beautiful great moving elegant filly Ghazaal Tahani was elected as National Junior Fillies Champion while Zeinah Al Hamd was at the group of the most beautiful fillies and won the Bronze medal for her nice owner Mrs Al Hamd. The Silver medal went to the beautiful black Rayhana Al Kaherah and this filly for sure will be remembered by all spectators as well as the judges who gave her 20 and 19.5 for type, head and neck. The filly was also honored for her correct conformation and great movements making the owner – Mr Mohamed Yasser El Gabri and his sons even happier. At the international show amongst the fillies the outstanding was chestnut gold Ghanyah Athbah. Statue-like with great face and harmonious body won the International Junior Fillies Championship for Athbah Stud K.S.A.Grey Bint Bessolea went Silver this time and her bay halfsister by Marwan Al Shaqab - Meshael



Al Khalediah Al Thaniya — bronze. In the seniors the fantastic international quality mares appeared in both shows and the entries to the nationals were between 8 and 13 each class, in the internationals — even as many as 20! Khorafa El Gabry, beautiful grey mare with great movements won just 0,16 point in front of Anbar Noor scored even more for type but less in total. Khorafa El Gabry was National Senior Mares Championship favourite winning the gold for El Gabry Stud in front of Mohgah Saqr — the mare combining the best of Arabian horse breed in one. Bronze medal went deservedly to Anbar Noor — for Leila Rabab Stud.Lets have a look who won in the international mares group... Of course the great Om El Bernadette was one of the horses on the way for the high trophies

for Saudi Arabia. She convinced the judges easily however the competition was tough and the bay Magora — well known internationally for her spectacular presence was hard to beat — she ended up with silver. Bronze medal went to Dalia KA the elegant grey mare that focused the eyes of everybody entering the arena.

Also the young males generations were of good quality this year — a lot of oustending movers and horses with great type and conformation. Lots of fillies as well as colts even better then the elders. There was Magd Al Farida well grown up grey colt showing the promise of future good quality sire. His type, harmonious body and movements brought him the gold medal. After him was



placed three years old Amirhom El Sheruk as silver and as bronze - Ghazal Al Yasser, young and perfectly built colt of nice face. Have the eyes open for him in the future shows! The international Champion gold medalist became Ibn Jameelat Al Khalediah fantastic 2 years old colt with truly great neck accompanied with type and correctness that all together brought another gold to Al Khalediah Farm, while the 3 years old Jareer Al Khalediah joined him with silver and Fakhr Al Khalediah as bronze. Great show for Al Stables! National Senior Khalediah Championship won consequently the well known Kenz Noor from Rabab Stud - just as he said: "veni, vidi, vici...". The silver medal went to Al Bawady Stud for Tamer Al Khalediah - the stallion full of charisma and

temperament. The bronze became Talal El Gabry that surely knew how to focus the eyes of both judges and spectators. The Internationals were dominated by the power stallion – famous Nijem Ibn Etrnity winning the gold deservedly and easily. Just after him was Awwal Al Amaar for El Farida Stud as Silver and fantastic mover Imperial Baareg sired by World Champion Imperial Baarez – as Bronze. "It's been an excellent show," everybody said when the sun was going down by el Zahraa on Sunday evening and left thinking of its benefits hoping to be there back again next year.


