In a proof of competence, optimism and resilience the board of directors of the ABCCA (Brazilian Arabian Horse Breeders Association), led by President Rodrigo Foz Forte, made sure to leave no detail uncovered and delivered a state of the art event in every sense.


For an entire week everyone who had the fortune to attend was able to take out their minds of all the troubles and worries and enjoy the Arabian horse at its best. A time to encounter breeders from all over Brazil and abroad, meet new friends and cheer for an array of extraordinary quality horses presented to the audience.

The show was held once again at the beautiful Helvetia Riding Center, in the city of Indaiatuba, from November 10th until the 13th, starting with the Brazil Cup on Wednesday and then the National championships from Thursday till Saturday.

On the following days, three farm tours were organized. The first at Haras Vila dos Pinheiros and the second at Haras das Faias, both presenting their unique breeding programs with many past national and international champions included. The last event was held back at the show grounds. It was called "Special Presentation", a

his year the Brazilian breeders made sure to bring their best of the best for the 40th celebration of the National Show. From the younger classes to the senior championships the depth of the quality proved once again that Brazil has been and still is one of the toughest grounds for show competition anywhere in the world. Interestingly enough it would be hard to notice any highly and tense competitive mood just by walking through the stands, for the overall atmosphere of friendship and joy amongst breeders and competitors always prevails.

A very diverse panel of judges was summoned for this year's Nationals: Christine Jamar from Belgium, John Rannenberg and Scott Brumfield from the U.S.A., Jerzy Bialobok from Poland, Mohamed Machmoum from Morocco and Leonardo Pinheiro Machado from Brazil.



The classes started on Thursday morning and one could see that there was not going to be any easy win this year. All the age groups were extremely competitive and the judges a lot of work in their hands.

The Junior Junior Filly Champioship was won by the beautiful grey filly My Best Surprise FWM, a daughter of *Bandit out of the El Tino daughter Nahla El Madan, bred and owned by Casa Branca Agropecuária Ltda.

Winnning the Silver was the chestnut Appolonia JSZ, bred and owned by Haras Santa Marta. She is by Dominic M out of the Versace daughter WWR Mystic Angel, herself a grand daughter of the Brazilian National Champion Mare NV Ali Bey (Ali Jamaal x Mystical Bey by Bey Shah).

Earning the Bronze was the elegant bay EMV Jyvana el Madan, from the first foal crop of Jyvar Meia Lua (El Jahez WH x Jyvara Maktub) out of Darlena el Madan by El Tino. She was bred by Estancia Monte Verde and Haras El Madan and sold to Usuf Alkwari prior to her win.

It is interesting to observe the strength of certain dam lines that manage to stand out despite the incredibly hard competition. In the Junior Junior Filly, the mothers of the Gold and Bronze Champion are full sisters, Nahla and Darlena El Madan, and Nahla also produced a Top Ten mare later on at the show.

The mother of the Silver Champion WWR Mystic Angel is also the mother of the Gold Filly Champion Mystica JSZ. In the following championship a son of Only Serondella won the Silver prize and started a sequence of unparalleled victories for five of her offspring that will be mentioned later on this article.

In the Junior Junior Colt Championship the lineup was nothing short of amazing. Two sons of Dominic M and a son of AF Maden shared the podium. Taking the Gold was the impressive bay Royal Dominion (Dominic M x Lumiar Ethna by RFI Maktub), bred and owned by Royal Arabians he is a maternal brother to Royal Asad, being out of the recently deceased black beauty Lumiar Ethna, what makes him even more precious.



Another impressive bay colt to earn high honors was Vision Serondella (AF Maden x Only Serondella by AAS Elishahh), bred and owned by Haras Serondella he seems to have an assured place as a future sire for the Amorosino family.

Onto the Junior Filly Championship the beautiful and feminine HK Sweet Ffanatica (HDF Lugano x HK La Fiesta Power by HK Keav Power) ended up with the Gold. A three quarter sister to the reigning Brazilian National Champion Young Stallion Vivaldi Al Shawan, she is by HDF Lugano who is fast becoming one of the most successful sons of FA El Shawan in Brazil, out of the accomplished HK La Fiesta Power. Ffanatica was bred and is owned by Cesar Schmidt of Haras Katu and Haras Al Hosçan. The traditional Haras dos Faveiros, owned by Dr. Jairo Queiroz Jorge and family, bred the elegant chestnut that took the Silver in the Championship. Pretty Lady JQ is by Dominic M out of the FA El Shawan daughter Nubbya El Shawan JQ. Tradition also runs in the blood of the Bronze Champion Filly, Deriva LM (Titanium LM x Khidayra LM) being the fifth consecutive generation of Haras Paiquere (Tercio e Lucio Miranda) breeding program. Her mother was also named Bronze Champion in the very deep Senior Mare class in the following day.

The Colt Championship brought in three very distinct and yet very handsome youngsters. All three of them from show winning mothers and internationally acclaimed sires. The Gold Champion was the exotic grey Kamal Ali HEC sired by the Chilean National Champion stallion HP Ali from whom he inherited his incredibly chiseled head out of National Champion Khyki HEC, bred and owned by Haras Estancia California. The Silver Champion Polahris HVP had already turned many heads when he won the coveted title of Premium Cup Champion at the Brazilian Breeders' Cup two months before. He is by the U.S. National Champion Polidoro FC, a son of DA Valentino and Abha Palma, both U.S. National Champions themselves. His mother Chaaris RBV is a daughter of World Champion Hariry Al Shaqab and was imported by Haras Vila dos Pinheiros, who also bred and owns Polahis HVP. The Bronze Champion was yet another son of the amazing Only Serondella, this time sired by Preludio OSB, Brazilian National Champion and the reigning U.S. National Champion Stallion.

A young filly that had been named highest score female of the Breeders' Cup show prior the Nationals was also awarded the Gold National Champion Young Fillly. Sapphire RB, bred and owned by Adriana and Alessandra Moura of Haras das Cascatas, is by the World Champion Emerald J out of Symphony RB by Sirajj UB. A very feminine and beautiful grey filly, she is highly praised everywhere she is presented. A duo of Dominic M daughters took the Silver and the Bronze spots and completed the lineup of greys in the final championships. The Silver title went to Haras 7 Flechas homebred Hermione 7F (x Beatrix ZR) while the Bronze went to Haras Santa Marta's Saphiraa JSZ (x Palitraa).

Dulce Rosas of Wolf Arabians was the breeder of the beautiful bay Gael W, who emerged as the Gold Champion of the Young Colt championship. He is by Vivaldi Al Shawan out of the RFI Maktub daughter NV Georgia. In the Silver spot was the silver beauty bred and owned by Haras Serondella, Unno Serondella, yet another son of Only Serondella and sired by the iconic El Jahez WH, being one of the beautiful five that won her the Produce of Dam class at Nationals and raised her to the status of World Aristocrat mare in a single show! The Bronze Champion Iago 7F added a second great victory to his breeder Haras 7 Flechas. He is by the El Tino son Valentin el Madan out of the FA El Shawan daughter Shiva el Shawan.

The Gold Filly championship was won by the statuesque chestnut Mystika JSZ (HDF Lugano x WWR Mystic Angel by Versace), who is bred and owned by the Chilean breeder Jorge Selume and his Haras Santa Marta. Followed by Rhona Vul do Divino (Vulcano HVP x Rhona Rach) in the Silver spot, whose full sister Vic Vul do Divino is an accomplished show mare including a National Top Ten to her credit. Ricardo Mesquita bred both sisters at Haras Divino. The Bronze Champion was the feminine bay EFC Pillar (Emerald J x FT Premia). Bred and owned by Enrico Franchini Carlone, she was also the unanimous Gold Champion Filly of the International Arabian Show in Tatuí earlier this year.

Yet another Emerad J son swept the Gold National Champion Colt championship two years in a row. Emir Sahara (Emerald J x Sahara Daghira by Denali BHF), is an impressive bay colt who is likely to start his breeding career next year for Haras Sahara. Both his mother Sahara Daghira and his maternal grandmother Sahara Gallina won top honors at the Nationals in the filly division. Another promise for the future is Haras JM's import An Victor, the Silver Champion Colt and one of the few sons of Scottsdale and U.S. National Champion stallion SM Azraff in Brazil. He is out of MC Vitoria, a daughter of yet another National Champion, Vitorio TO. Earning the Bronze title was Royal Destiny, a bay son of Dominic M and the Brazilian Reserve Champion Young Mare RFI Sensation, a daughter of the amazing Jazeer de Wiec.

Friday night was the time to watch the finals for both the Young Mares and Young Stallions. The classes were unusually large for the audience's delight, but the usual quality was evermore surprising.

From the seventeen mares that were entered in the Young Mare class, ten were chosen to continue their aim for the Gold. The victory went to Preferida Rach, a beautiful bay mare aptly named by the Salibas, her breeders and owners, since her name means favorite in Portuguese and that's exactly what she was: a crowd favorite. Preferida Rach was last year's Silver Young Mare Champion and a National Gold Champion Filly in 2019, so this win is the crowning for a successful string of victories.

Felma LA, another beautiful bay mare was the winner of the Silver title. Owned by Cristiane Durante Guardia and bred by Haras Cruzeiro, who had leased her father Mashoor Al Mohamadia with Haras Engenho for two years, Felma is a second generation bred at the farm. Her mother Bela LA is by their chief sire and Brazilian National Champion Sihr Ibn Massai. Mashoor is by two iconic World Champion siblings; both bred by Marieta Sallas of SES Planes and both by Marwan al Shaqab, Abha Qatar and Abha Palma. He left a total of 55 get in Brazil prior to his return, two of which went all the way to the top at Nationals, Felma LA and her brother Fuad, later named National Gold Champion Senior Stallion.

The Bronze title went to Rhaydee Serondella, a beautiful bay daughter of El Tino and Only Serondella, the show's Silver Champion Senior Mare and the

mother of five winners at the show. Besides Rhaydee, her daughter Simply Serondella (by TS Khidam al Shawan) received Top Ten honors. If that wasn't enough yet a third Serondella bred placed among the top ten mares, the fabulous Gazal Al Shaqab daughter Rhavina Serondella.

Following the Young Mares and closing the night in great style were the Young Stallions. This is a key category that is watched closely by everyone who is planning on breeding decisions for the following year. Ten stallions entered the ring and the Gold medal went to the South African import EKS Farouk with very strong blood connections with Brazil. A beautiful bay son of the much talked about Ibn Farid, who in turn is by the World Champion producer RFI Farid, bred by Carlos and Rodrigo Forte of RFI Arabians. His mother is by World Champion EKS Alihandro and his maternal great grandmother, Lucille HCF, was bred in Brazil by Haras Capim Fino. His first foal crop is much anticipated at Haras Cruzeiro.

The Silver Championship went to Cash del Tino JM bred by José Alves of Haras JM. He has done a solid show career prior to his win being also the winner at the International Show held in Tatuí a couple of months before. He is by National Champion El Tino who has recently been exported to the U.S out of the beautiful WH Justice Stig Justhine. His half brother Calvin del Tino JM, also bred and owned by Haras JM was also among the Top Ten winners.

The beautiful chestnut Abbas Al Ventur, bred and owned by Haras Al Ventur of the Gama family was the Bronze winner. An amazing stallion in the making, he has an unique pedigree that represents a blend of two iconic breeding programs in Brazil, that of Haras Meia Lua and Haras das Cascatas. He is one of the few sons left in Brazil by Halyr Meia Lua before his departure to the U.S. His mother is a daughter of none other than the iconic Brazilian and U.S. National Champion Mare Honey's Delight RB with the great FA El Shawan.

And finally on Saturday there was the grand finale, the much-awaited Senior Finals. The mares were the first to enter the ring to be judged. It was a very deep class in terms of quality, highly praised by all the five judges, with several past National Champions and Champion producers shown. Following the choosing of the Top Ten, the announcement of the three winners was released.

Haras Paiquere won the Bronze with its beautiful homebred Khidayra LM, a daughter of World Champion Khidar out of a daughter of Erbil, imported from Poland and a son of the icons Monogramm and Esklawa. Earlier in the show her daughter Deriva LM was named Bronze Junior Champion Filly.



The multi National Champion Only Serondella came back to the ring bringing along five of her sons and daughters and managed not only to emerge as the Silver Champion Senior Mare, but also had the distinction of having all five of her get placing in their age classes and four of them winning in the championships. She is a daughter of AAS Elishahh out of Jelabie Serondella who is a daughter of Vektor El Ludjin, a son of Ludjin El Jamaal and the Bey Shah daughter Shannghai. She represents five generations of the Serondella program and is most definitely the pride and joy of the Amorosino clan.

The battle for the Gold was truly epic and the victorious mare was the ethereal grey FT Sofia El Bogart. A mare of exquisite type and movement who came into the ring with her head held high almost as if she was certain that the highest podium was rightfully hers. She gave an amazing show with her handler Arthur Nascimento and her victory brought her fans to go wild with joy. By the Ali Jamaal grandson Bogart El Perseus out of the Magnum Psyche granddaughter, FT Sofia was brought back to the show ring after a long hiatus. She was the mother of last year's Silver Champion Stallion FT Saeed (by*El Tino) and is bred and owned by Flavia Torres and Bra Machado from FT Arabians.

The last class of the show was the much-anticipated Senior Stallion class. A highly competitive group of stallions divided the opinion of the judges and made the whole category even more interesting to watch.

The Gold Champion came from the center region of Brazil, from the beautiful state of Mato Grosso. Fuad, RD Capriotti, a very typey grey son of World Champion Shanghai EA was chosen as the Bronze Champion. Bred in the U.S.A by Rae Dawn Arabians she is out of the Marwan Al Shaqab, daughter Mi Morena. He is now part of the impressive string of stallions owned by José Alves of Haras JM, who was also the breeder of the Silver Young Champion Stallion Cash Del Tino JM.

a previous National Champion Silver Colt, he is by Mashoor Al Mohamadia out of the beautiful champion DOD Fiorella, who has been exported to the Middle East. He was bred by Haras DOD and is owned by Marco Tulio Filho who brought a large crowd of friends to cheer for him. The beautiful bay Fuad was the only Brazilian born out of the top three stallions in the class.

No stranger to the winners circle AAS Elishahh claimed the Silver Champion spot during this Nationals show. He has been also named U.S. National Champion Yearling Colt prior to his importation to Brazil. Interestingly, as mentioned before, his daughter Only Serondella also assured the Silver medal in the Senior Mare class. Elishahh was imported to Brazil by Luciana Fasano of Fazenda Floresta. He is by multi National Champion Eden C out of the Versace daughter Sempre, whose mother was Tulle El Jamaal, bred in Brazil by Lenita Perroy and named U.S. Reserve National Champion Mare.

The Brazil Cup

he second round of Brazil Cup opened the show activities. This year five Brazilian judges were invited for the show: Saul Borsari Neto, Marcelo Jubran, Gustavo Vibian, Guilherme Távora and João Henrique Netto.

The Junior Filly class Gold championship was won by Fantastika Sirajj JM (*Sirajj UB x Tshaklina Jully JM) whose paternal sister Crystal Sirajj JM (*Sirajj UB x Alyssa Crystal RLC) won the Bronze spot. Sirajj UB is a son of World Champion and U.S. National Champion Marajj out of Satin Mist, a full sister to the iconic Muscat daughter Amber Satin.

Both of the above fillies were bred and owned by Haras JM who also bred the mother of the Silver Champion filly Ybeauty Dominic HVP (*Domininc M x Ybeauty di Famess JM) bred and owned by Haras Vila dos Pinheiros.

The Junior Colt championship was dominated by representatives of the Mirage sire line through two grandsons of DA Valentino and a grandson of RFI Maktub. One of the most prominent daughters of El Tino bred by Haras El Madan, she is out of the beautiful TM Jamili who traces in tail female to one of Brazil's greatest Aristocrat mares from Haras Fortaleza, the Cognac daughter *Apricot Lady. The Silver spot went to Basilica Rach (Ragnar Rach x Blues Dream Rach), recently acquired by the great Chilean breeder Jaime Valdes from Rach Arabians. Annete HVP bred and owned by Haras Vila dos Pinheiros received the Bronze. A beautiful bay mare with a pedigree full of stars that includes the World Champion Kahil Al Shaqab out of a daughter of U.S. National Reserve Champion Besson Carol out of a full sister to multi National Champion Magnum Chall HVP, who was also bred at Haras Vila dos Pinheiros.

Western Pleasure

Western Pleasure classes have always been favorites among Brazilians when it comes to performance. The first Brazilian bred perfomance horse ever to win in a big show abroad, was Munir HCF a bay Western Pleasure horse bred by Haras Capim Fino who reached high honors at the Scottsdale Show back in the early 90's. The gifted Zezé Rodrigues rode Munir HCF to the victory then and this year he won 3 of the 4 Western classes at the Nationals with ZR Training Center.

This year four classes were offered in the Western division: Maiden, Young Horses, Senior and Open. Winning those respectively were:

Young Horse Champion – Lady Miracle FWM (*FA El Shawan x Mega Star LL), bred and owned by Casa Branca Agropastoril. Ridden by ZR Training Center.

Maiden horse Champion – Strong Osiris GV (Gran Osiris x Evoga GV), Bred by Raphael Casquel – Haras Gran Via and owned by Haroldo Dante.

Senior Champion – Brigitte VHP (Magnum Psyche x Dulcinea BHF), bred and owned by Haras Vila dos Pinheiros . Ridden by Arnildo Faleiro.

Open Champion – Prince Aladdin FWM (El Tino x Jasmin FWM), Bred and owned by Casa Branca Agropastoril. Ridden by ZR Training Center.

Amateur Champion – Lady Miracle FWM (*FA El Shawan x Mega Star LL), bred and owned by Casa Branca Agropastoril. Ridden by Stephanie Rodrigues.

English Pleasure

Two classes were offered within the English Division namely Maiden and Open. Both of them were won by Beaufort HVP (*FA El Shawan x Kismee el Madan), bred and owned by Haras Vila dos Pinheiros and ridden by Arnildo Faleiro.

In addition to the halter and performance classes the show also brought the popular most classic, the Liberty Class, the Get of Sire and Produce of Dam classes. The winners of the Most Classic Head for females and males were respectively Ushuaia Serondella (Quasim CRH x Queridah Serondella) bred and owned by Haras Serondella and Calvin del Tino JM (*El Tino x Marcessa FF), bred and owned by Haras JM.

The winner of the competitive Produce of Dam was the beautiful Silver National Senior Champion Mare Only Serondella for her breeder Haras Serondella. All five of her get placed in their classes, Veron, Vison, Unno, Simply and Rhaydee Serondella. Two of them won Silver honors and two of them won Bronze championships. That unparalleled achievement assured her an instant place in the World Aristocrat list not to mention that it contributed considerably to the title of both best Breeder and best Exibitor of the show that was earned by Haras Serondella and the Amorosino family.

ANCAF

The circuit of ANCAF was concurrently held in the outside arena of Helvetia Riding Center. It was a record breaker in every sense and a success beyond every previous addition. The number of entries and exhibitors was extremely high, proving that the ridden Arabian Horse has never been more popular, thanks to the great joint work of the Functional Arabian Horse Association and ABCCA, who have been strongly fostering ridden events in all the parts of Brazil, with incentives for young riders and introducing prize money awards.

This year 8 categories were offered in barrel racing, five in base racing, three in Cross-Country and one in Show Jumping.
