



# Menton

## Mediterranean & Arab Countries Arabian Horse Championship 26 & 27 June 2021

M stands for Menton. It also stands for magnificent, magical, mesmerising and marvellous. All these adjectives are accurate but still not enough to describe this year's Mediterranean and Arab Countries Arabian Horse Championship. The show held annually in the fantastic atmosphere of the French Riviera is always a spectacular event. However, the 2021 edition was truly special for several different reasons. Firstly, it was a nice round anniversary as the organizers, Madame Chazel and Madame Briot, have hosted the show for the last 30 years. Secondly, the quality of the horses was extremely high. For years, some of the most remarkable representatives of the Arabian breed have been presented in the ring on the beautiful Menton beach but this year's participants set an incredibly high bar when it comes to their beauty, quality and class. Such a high level of presented horses also meant a challenging task for the

8 well-known international judges: Mr Cedés Bakker from the Netherlands, Mrs Sylvie Eberhardt from Germany, Mrs Irina Stigler from Russia, Mr Eric Gear from France, Mr Ferdinand Huemer from Austria, Mrs Ann Norden from Sweden, Mr Fausto Scanzi from Italy and Mr Marek Trela from Poland. Over the two days, the jury had to assess and mark 96 high-quality horses; including 62 female and 34 male contenders.

The sunny and hot Saturday afternoon was all about the lovely ladies. At 2 o'clock, without any unnecessary delay, we were to witness the first class of yearling fillies with 6 pretty participants in the ring. The lead was taken by the classy chestnut Perfecta Al Jassimya (Picasso Di Mar x Jazanah Al Jassimya) bred and owned by Al Jassimya Farm, whose great marks for type and movement resulted in a high total score of 91.83 points. With a 0.50-point difference in the final marks, the

second place was claimed by the typey grey Excalibur EA daughter, Danah Pearl (out of SW DA Vidica), for her breeder and owner Abdulla Zayed Saeed Khalifa Alqubaisi. The last filly in this class that qualified for the championships was the pretty bay Emerald J daughter, Falak Al Khashab (out of SA Minerva), bred by Al Khashab Stud and owned by A&H Arabians. Class 1B, which was the continuation of the youngest fillies, was a decisive triumph of the exotic bay D Thariah, bred by Dubai Arabian Horse Stud and owned by Al Wajba Stud. This typey filly, sired by FA El Rasheem and out of the beautiful WH Justice daughter D Azalea, received 8 maximum marks; 4x20 for type and 4x20 for head and neck, which resulted in a great total score of 92.33 points. The second place with exactly 92.00 points, including 4x20 for head and neck, was awarded to another bay beauty, Demasheq Alsayed (Validoro x Delight S Divah RB), making her breeder and owner, Alsayed Stud, happy and proud. The third place belonged to Albaydaa Farm and their lovely Marajj daughter, Majeeda Al Baydaa (out of Madinat Al Baydaa), who finished the class with a good total score of 91.58 points. From among 8 high-quality 2-year-old fillies participating in class 2A, the judges chose three gorgeous grey girls to qualify for the junior female championship. The highest score of 91.67 points and the first place in the class went to the refined grey El Medida (Morion x El Medara), bred and owned by Michalow State Stud. For the second place there was a tie between two equally typey contenders: Luzia N (Calypso OS x Fer Lisaline), bred by Javier Fernandez Echarri and owned by Hanaya Stud, and DA Amira (Wadee Al Shaqab x DA Alihandra), bred and owned by Cornelia Holnberger. Eventually, a slightly higher score for movement positioned Luzia N before DA Amira in the final result of this class. The second section of the 2-year-old fillies featured only 5 contenders but their quality was very even and their final scores did not go under 91.00 points. Again there was a tie, this time for the first place in the class, between two amazing fillies;

the exotic bay Excalibur EA daughter RDS Exquisite (out of Angelica KS), bred by Eaid and Amira Safady and owned by Al Orasia Stud, and the powerfully moving grey Ghawiat Al Shiraa, sired by D Seraj and out of PF Panama, bred by Ajman Stud and now owned by Al Shiraa Stables. They both received a very high score of 92.08 points but RDS Exquisite, who received 6 maximum marks, including 4x20 for type, won the class in the end. The bay CBA Indiyana (Wadee Al Shaqab x Ilena El Aryes), bred and owned by Bouche Arabians, scored exactly 92.00 points and thus was the last filly in this class to qualify for the Sunday championships. A large and strong class of 3-year-olds finished the junior female competition on Saturday. The fact that 13 out of 14 contestants received scores above 90.00 points, reinforced the extremely high quality of the presented horses. The winner of the class, the gorgeous grey Siwar Al Shaqab by SMA Magic One and out of the unforgettable Abha Myra, took the class by storm and with a spectacular score of 93.00 points, she proved to be a worthy successor of her legendary dam. Without a doubt, with 3x20 for type and 5x20 for head and neck, she is the pride and joy of her breeder and owner, the world-famous Al Shaqab Stud. Almost flying in the air through the arena, the bay Alexandra RC (FA El Rasheem x Amabelle) got maximum scores not only for movement (3x20), but also a 20 for type and 2x20 for head and neck, securing a strong second position with the total score of 92.50 points. Such a great result must have pleased her breeder and owner, the Royal Cavalry of Oman. The third filly that was chosen by the judges to be seen one more time in the Sunday championships, represented Dubai Arabian Horse Stud. The lovely grey D Judi, who scored only 0.25 points less than Alexandra, is by AJ Azzam and out of a super-producer Elle Flamenca. Her final result of 92.25 points included 2x20 for head and neck.

However, it was the following senior female classes that raised the already high temperature of the show even

more. The first class of 4-7-year-old mares belonged to the Michalow-bred bay Ekstern daughter Protekcja (out of Pentra), who bewitched the judges with her ground-covering trot and received 3x20 for movement, 2x20 for type and a 20 for head and neck, which gave her a great total score of 93.17 points and the leading position in the class. Second and third placement again resulted from a tie between two elegant grey mares, both of whom scored exactly 92.00 points. Higher score for movement resulted in TM Galileah (Shanghai EA x Karolina), bred by Jose Orlando A Teirxeira Junior and owned by Bader Alhumaidi, beating out Bianca AL (Halyr Meia Lua x Giuliana El Shawan), bred by Agropec Leopoldino and now owned by Hanaya Stud. The following section of 4-7-year-old mares was a wonderful victory of the magnificent Mozn Albidayer (SMA Magic One x Mattaharii), whose total score of 93.50 points was a result of 13x20, including a full set of 20s for type and for head and neck and another 20 for movement. Mozn, who became Gold Champion Senior Mare in Menton a year before, is currently owned by Al Wajba Stud but, as the second part of her name suggests, she was originally bred by Albidayer Stud, the breeder of another grey SMA Magic One daughter who ended up in the third position of the same class. Razan Albidayer (out of Qamar Albidayer), now owned by Hanaya Stud, qualified for the championships with the final mark of 91.83 points. In between the two grey beauties bred by Albidayer Stud, another snow-white mare finished the competition on the second position in the class. The Silver Champion Senior Mare at the last year's Menton show, the wonderful Wildona (Shanghai EA x Wilda), bred and owned by Michalow State Stud, this time received 'merely' 92.00 points from the judges. The last class of senior mares, being also the last competition of the day, featured 7 high-quality contenders. The flea-bitten flying beauty D Aziza (Ajman Moniscione x Midnight Kiss J), the 2020 Menton bronze medallist, and now the highest scoring mare of the class, who at

the same time was also the highest scoring female of the show, received as much as 93.75 points, which must have added greatly to the happiness of both her breeder Dubai Arabian Horse Stud and her owner Hanaya Stud. Her fantastic marks included 6x20 for type, 5x20 for head and neck and 3x20 for movement. The current owner of D Aziza, the famous Hanaya Stud from Switzerland, had a double reason to celebrate, as her beautiful bay stable companion Alsa (Kahil Al Shaqab x Alameda), bred by Janow Podlaski State Stud, came second with just a slightly lower score of 93.58 points, including 3x20 for type, a 20 for head and neck and 4x20 for her powerful animated trot. The last competitor to qualify for the senior female championship was the elegant grey Rihab Al Nasser (Marwan Al Shaqab x Remal Al Nasser) who scored 92.50 points, while representing her breeder and owner, Al Nasser Stud.

The feeling of excitement and anxiety was in the air since the early hours on Sunday morning. The first section of yearling colts started exactly at 9 a.m. with 8 charming colts entering the arena. The first win of the day belonged to the classy chestnut Marwan Al Shaqab son, Maayer Al Jassimya (out of MD Mirka), and his proud breeder and owner, Al Jassimya Farm. For the second place there was again a tie between two bay colts; WF Gawin (Magic Magnifique x WW Gawina) and D Rasel (FA El Rasheem x Ladi Veronika), which ended in the victory of the exotic Magic Magnifique son over the refined FA El Rasheem son due to the difference in the scores for movement. The former was bred by Madelene Whihaten and is now owned by Aingeru Vilabrille Cimas, and the latter was bred and still belongs to Dubai Arabian Horse Stud. The next section of the yearling colts was again a decisive win of Al Jassimya Farm and their almost-flying-in-the-air Lehon. This beautiful bay son of FA El Rasheem and Aragia Vanilla beat the other 6 contenders, while receiving the final score of 92.92 points, with 4x20 for type and a full set of 20s

for movement. Second and third place in the class were occupied by two grey colts bred and owned by Dubai Arabian Horse Stud. The exotic D Sharar (D Seraj x FT Shaella) finished the competition as second, with the total score of 92.58 points, while his stable colleague, D Shahhar (Excalibur EA x D Shihanah), qualified for the championships from the third position with 92.00 points. Class 7 for the 2-year-old colts was again a success of Al Jassimya Farm, who is the current owner of the gorgeous grey Excalibur EA son, RDS Armani (out of Stellaris BPA), bred by Amira and Eiad Safady. With the total score of 92.50 points, he finished the class ahead of the phenomenal grey Muranas Nader (Emerald J x Muranas Nabila), representing his breeder Michaela Weidner and his owner Guy Jamar, as well as the exotic chestnut Arjuwan Albidayer (AJ Marzan x Allezandra Albidayer), bred and owned by Albidayer Stud. Muranas Nader received 92.25 points, 0.17 points more than his rival from the UAE. The podium of the last class for junior colts was occupied by two bay FA El Rasheem sons and a grey Shanghai EA son. D Sheimaz (out of Lady Veronika), bred and owned by Dubai Arabian Stud, received 92.58 points, including 3x20 for type, 4x20 for head and neck and a 20 for movement, which secured his leading position in the class ahead of his paternal half-brother, Mutabahi Al Hawajer (out of ZT Magrumi), who received 92.25 points, and the typey Shanghai EA son, Pandorez O (out of Pocahontas K), whose final result was 91.08 points. Mutabahi was bred by Al Hawajer Stud and is now owned by Sama Najd Stud and Pandorez was born at Sweden Arabian Stud and now represents Jalyla Arabians Stud.

There was no time to take a breath after the electrifying junior male classes, as the senior stallion competition started straight away after class 8. Two classes for senior stallions were not particularly crowded but still extremely exciting. The winner of class 9 for 4-7-year-old stallions received 93.08 points, exactly the same total score as the stallion that classified in the second position.

Higher marks for type decided about the victory of the charismatic Saif Albidayer (Excalibur EA x Nesj El Markhisa), bred and owned by Albidayer Stud, over the masculine D Seraj (FA El Rasheen x Ladi Veronika), belonging to Dubai Arabian Horse Stud. Third place with 92.67 points was the result of the reigning Straight Egyptian World Champion Stallion, Naseem Al Rashediah (Al Adeed Al Shaqab x Nabaweyyah Ezzain), proudly representing his owner and breeder, Al Rashediah Stud. The last qualifying class of the day featured only one participant but his presentation was a feast for the eyes of all Arabian horse aficionados. Although the elegant Excalibur EA (Shanghai EA x Essence of Marwan EA), bred by Equus Arabians and now owned by Akmal Stud, was an obvious winner of the class, he did it in a big way. Not only did he become the highest scoring male but also his final marks turned out to be the highest overall score of the whole show. With 20s across the board for type and movement as well as 5x20 for head and neck, this 10-year-old snow-white stallion achieved an unbelievably high total score of 94.83 points. Fortunately, the pause after the male classes allowed all the participants and spectators to have a break from all the excitement of the competition and enjoy the spectacular scenery of the French Riviera.

The show resumed at 3 p.m. with a very special presentation that was supposed to be a warm-up before the most exciting part of the show – the championships. The Yearling Female section with only 5 participants did not leave any doubts as to who should become a Gold Champion Yearling Filly. The beautiful bay D Thariah, now proudly representing Al Wajba Stud, became the only unanimous champion of the show. The silver and bronze medals were divided between the chestnut Al Jassimya Farm contender, Perfecta, and another bay beauty, Majeeda, bred and owned by Albaydaa Farm. When it comes to junior fillies, the judges finally decided that the gold medal would be awarded to the outstanding representative of Qatar, the 3-year-old grey Siwar Al

Shaqab, while the 2-year-old bay Bahraini representative, RDS Exquisite, would become Silver Champion Junior Filly for her owner, Al Orasia Stud. Last but not least, the bronze medal went to the 3-year-old grey D Judi, representing Dubai Arabian Horse Stud and the UAE. Senior Female Championship was a spectacular success of Hanaya Stud from Switzerland, as two of its representatives ended up on the podium. The feminine 12-year-old flea-bitten D Aziza became Gold Champion Senior Mare, while the 8-year old bay moving machine Alsa was awarded the bronze medal. The middle place on the podium and the Silver Champion Senior Mare title were granted to the gorgeous grey Mozn Albidayer, proudly representing the Qatari Al Wajba Stud. As befits the highest scoring female of the show, D Aziza was also the winner of the Best in Show Female title.

The temperature of the show reached the peak during the male championships. It came as no surprise that the refined bay Lehon added another medal and the Gold Champion Yearling Colt title to the already impressive collection of trophies won by Al Jassimya Farm from Qatar. Dubai Arabian Horse Stud also collected another trophy for their Silver Champion Yearling Colt, the exotic grey D Sharar, while the beautiful bay representative of Spain, WF Gawin, proudly stood on the podium with a bronze medal on his chest. Again, in the Junior Male Championship, the judges could not unanimously agree when it comes to the placement on the podium. However, the Gold Champion Junior Colt title went to the winner of class 8, the 3-year-old bey D Sheimaz and his breeder and owner, Dubai Arabian Horse Stud, while the silver medal was awarded to the winner of the other qualifying class for junior colts, the 2-year-old grey RDS Armani, belonging to Al Jassimya Farm. The third place on the podium and the bronze medal were granted to the 2-year-old bay representative of Sama Najd Stud, Mutabahi Al Hawajer. Nevertheless, the most exciting male championship was the one featuring 4 stunning senior stallions, where the judges

were almost unanimous while electing the gold medallist. 7 out of 8 judges selected the charismatic 10-year-old snow-white Excalibur EA as worthy of wearing the gold medal, making his current owner, Akmal Stud from Saudi Arabia, even more proud. Also, Dubai Arabian Horse Stud had a very good reason to celebrate as their masculine 6-year-old grey D Seraj was chosen as Silver Champion Senior Stallion. With the loud spontaneous applause from the audience, the last champion of the day was selected by the judges. Having the same score in the championship as D Seraj, the exotic Straight Egyptian stallion, Naseem Al Rashediah, won another medal for Bahrain, becoming Bronze Champion Senior Stallion. The reigning SE World Champion could have stood one step higher on the podium if it was not for the fact that D Seraj had a higher score in the qualifying class. Similarly to its female equivalent, the Best in Show Male title was awarded to the eldest of all gold male champions, the highest scoring horse of the show, the excellent Excalibur EA.

The two exhilarating days of the Menton show passed very quickly, almost in a blink of an eye. However, they have left the attendees with long lasting memories of amazing Arabian horses flying in the ring on the marvellous Menton beach. If I were to use **MENTON** as an acronym, my choice of words would be as follows: **Magical**, **Exciting**, **Never-failing**, **Tremendous**, **Outstanding** and **Noble**. Why? The answer to this question is quite simple: in this **Magical** place on the French Riviera the **Exciting** Menton show **Never** fails to amaze Arabian horse lovers from all over the world. And it is all thanks to the organizers who, with **Tremendous** amount of work, always strive to present the most **Outstanding** of these **Noble** creatures. Let the memory of this amazing 30th anniversary be a good omen for the following years. May the hooves of the most remarkable representatives of the Arabian breed keep shifting the sands of the Menton beach for many more years to come. □


