Pride of Poland and Summer Sale

The 44th National Arabian Horse Show (August 12-14), which is the most important day for the Polish Arabian horse breeders and lovers, was not an easy one for the participants this year. Unfortunately, the weather was the main host of the show. The heavy rains forecasted a week before the show proved to be the biggest obstacle and influenced the course of the show. While on Friday we managed to hold the Classes in the elegantly prepared outer ring, Saturday brought a total break in the weather. Of course, no one has any influence on the weather and "fortunately" the Horse Stud in Janów Podlaski has a covered hall in which show participants could hide from the rain. Such a solution was obviously justified, but the preparation of the hall, or rather the lack of it, was surprising. However, that was not the only novelty. This year's show ring was prepared by the organizers right next to the historic Clock Stable (Stajnia Zegarowa) from 1848, designed by the famous architect Henryk Marconi.

„The relocation of the show and auction under the Clock Stable was primarily intended to refer to the many years of Arabian horse breeding tradition at Janów Podlaski Stud. The Clock Stable with its characteristic tower is the most recognisable element of Janów Stud by the breed enthusiasts all over the world. The show and the auction thus took place in the heart of the historic stud, and the historic stable was the best backdrop and most apt decoration for both events.”

This is how the venue choice was explained by Krzysztof Kierzek, president of Polish Jockey Club PKWK, organizer.

It was also new that the gelding Classes were held for the first time. Moreover, on Friday morning, before the start of the show, riders competed in the first August Championship for Arabian Sport Horses. The competition was organized by the Polish Arabian Horse Breeders Association PZHKA in cooperation with Janów Podlaski Stud. 11 pairs entered the following competitions: Classic Pleasure, Hunter Pleasure and Polish Historical Costume.

With very volatile weather conditions, the jury consisting of Antonia Bautista from Spain, Josy Everars from Belgium, Marianne Tengstedt from Denmark, Zico Guardia from Brazil and Ali Darawsha from Israel made an effort to judge the horses during the show. The jury judged a total of 109 horses, 55 of which were state-bred and 54 were privately bred.

Michałów Stud was successful in winning 4 gold and 3 silver medals and a number of special prizes. Private breeders did great, as they received 2 gold, 3 silver and 4 bronze medals. Janów Podlaski Stud remained in the shadows - 2 bronze medals together with Białka Stud - one gold medal in the Gelding Championship.



Friday (12.08) Yearling Colt Class - Morion's sons in the lead

As always, the yearling colts went first and presented themselves in two Classes, 5 horses and 6 horses each. The judges' marks in the Yearling Colt Classes were not very generous, and the highest marks were awarded carefully. Only one of the colts was awarded a "20", or even two "20", for movement. Ultimately, only two colts, one from Michałów and one from Janów Podlaski, managed to obtain 90-odd points. The definite triumphers in both Classes were the sons of Michałów's stallion Morion (Kahil Al Shaqab - Mesalina) and his home stud. Class A and Class B were won by Michałów's pupils: Delikt (Diara by Eryks) with a score of 89.70 points and El Medar (El Medonia by Shanghai EA) whose score of 92.00 points significantly exceeded the scores of his other colleagues. El Medar's score was made up of the aforementioned two "20s" for movement.

In Class A, this time privately-bred (Stanisław Sławiński) son of Morion came in second place. It was the bay colt Foggir (Foggir by Gaspar) with a score of 89.70 points.

This time the gray colt Evalion Zalia (Dominic M-Evolett / Ajman Moniscione), bred/owned by Katarzyna Dolińska-Witkowska was third with a score of 89.30 points. In Class B, a dark bay colt from Janów Podlaski Stud was just behind El Medar - Al Narciso (Erantis-Amorena / Pogrom). This eye-catching colt received 90.10 points, including quite high

marks for movement: 4 x 19.5 points and 1x 19.00 points. Elon KL (QR Marc-Erigone / Ekstern) bred/owned by Klikowa Arabians Stud was third in this Class with a score of 89.30 points. The first three places in the Class guaranteed participation in the Sunday Yearling Colt Championship.

Junior Colt Class – it was an even fight

In the Two-year-old Colt Class, two rivals from this year's show in Białka performed most effectively, i.e. Nahil Al Khalediah (Ghaith Al Zobair - Nawal Al Khalediah / Forteynas Magic), bred/owned by Polska AKF Sp. z o.o. and another son of Morion El Brillo (Larinera by Empire), bred and owned by Michałów Stud. Both colts were well prepared and in good condition, so the judges awarded them the same scores, i.e. 90.90 points. However, Nahil Al Khalediah won a higher score for movement, with which he "took revenge" for the show in Białka. Both mates guaranteed themselves a place in the Junior Colt Championship in which they competed with the winner of the Three-year-old Colt Class Chicago (Wortex Kalliste-Calatea / Ekstern) bred/owned by Marek Kondrasiuk. This chestnut colt managed to achieve a score of 90.80 points with three "20s" and 2 x 19.5 points for movement! The second place was awarded to the privately-bred (GA Rancho Artur Gibała) grey Wirton GA (Pharaoh HBV – Weihburg's Nectar/Lawrence El Gazal) with a score of 89.40 points.

Senior Stallion Class - like father like son

Ames JR (Psytdel-Altara / Gazal Al Shaqab) bred/owned by Janusz Ryżkowski qualified for the finals with the second score of 90.50 points (including 2x20 for movement) together with the snow-white well-prepared Psyche Keret (Khidar - Psyche Victoria / Ekstern) bred / owned by Chrcynno-Pałac Stud, who was awarded 91.30 points. In this Class, just like in the Junior Colt Class, 4 (2 per class) stallions qualified for the Championship.

On Friday evening, the last to appear in the ring were the geldings. This Class was also the Championship, so the places won in this Class were tantamount to the Polish Gelding Championship. The gold medal was won by the 5-year-old Parillus (Ascot DD - Parilla / Enzo) representing the Białka Stud. The silver medal went to the gray Korab (Pegasus - Karbala / Emigrant) bred in Michałów, owned by Magdalena Helak-Kulczyńska. The bronze medal was won by bay Eunor (Ganges - Eunora / Gazal Al Shaqab), who also comes from Michałów Stud, but is owned by Aneta Chrzęstek-Szyc.

Saturday (13.08) in the driving rain. Yearling Filly Class.

On Saturday, black clouds came over the stud and unfortunately stayed there until the end of the day accompanied by heavy rain. This day was a real test for the

organizers, and a test of patience for the guests, horse owners and all participants. The rain was so strong that there was water in the show ring. The yearling fillies were the first to appear between the raw walls of the hall, and there were plenty of them who came to Janów - a total of 25 young ladies who competed in three Classes. Therefore, 9 horses entered the Yearling Filly Championship, 3 from each Class. In Class A, two daughters of Star Farid qualified from first and second place: bay Eri Starra (El Hajfa / Etnodrons Psyche) bred/owned by Petroniusz Frejlich with a score of 90.70 points and also bay Bella Rose (Bogini Marajj by Marajj) bred/owned by GR Paweł Redestowicz, who got 90.30 points. Morion's beautiful daughter, Janów's Bella Mia (Beira / Pogrom) with a score of 89.80 points, came third in the Class. This filly could compete for high titles with some good training and being in good hands as she is full of delicacy and a certain finesse. In Class B and Class C, Michałów's horses took the lead again. First and second places were won by: Labonita (Dominic M-Lakonia / Chimeryk) with 90.80 points and Driada (Al Ayal AA-Dolores / Kabsztad) with 89.20 points and in Class C: Wieża Uczuć (Medalion-Wieża Bajek / Abha) Qatar) with 91.30 points and Mahima (El Omari-Mahira / Ekstern) with 90.40 points. The third place and qualification for the finals were won by: Janów's Brodia (Erantis-Belinda / Kahil Al Shaqab) with 89.10 points and privately-bred (Wojciech Parczewski) Mandoria (Psytdel-Minerwina / Kahil Al Shaqab) with 90.10 points. It was difficult to identify a definite favourite in this category, but

the mentioned Labonita, Bella Mia, and Wieża Uczuć who won 4 "20s" for movement, certainly stood out! The finals were believed to bring surprises and so they did.

Junior Filly Class

Two representatives of the Two-year-old and Three-year-old Filly Class qualified for the Junior Filly Championship. This privilege of first place in the Two-year-old Filly Class was won by the charming Bogini Róż PA (Kahil Al Shaqab-Black Rose / Abyad AA) bred/owned by PPH "Parys" Sp. z o.o., who was awarded 91.40 points, including one "20" for movement. The second place went to another daughter of the outstanding Morion - Michałów's El Mariella (El Marina by Ganges) with a slightly lower score of 91.20 points. In the Three-year-old Filly Class there were no surprises because the first place was again taken by Morion's daughter, also bred in Michałów, the grey El Medida (El Medara by Shanghai EA), who got two "20s": one for type and one for head and neck which came to a total of 92.10 points. A step behind her, in the second place, came Echo Anastazja (Psyche Keret-Echo Aurora / Eternity Ibn Navarrone) bred/owned by Chrcynno-Palac Stud. The judges awarded her high marks for movement: 3 x "20" and 2 x 19.5, which ultimately resulted in a score of 91.90 points.

Senior mares - the highest score of the show finally awarded

Michałów Stud made it well in the 4-6-year-old Mare Class A. Two representatives of this stud took first and second place and qualified for the finals. The leader was the beautiful El Esmera (Sahm El Arab-Esmeraldia / QR Marc) to whom the judges (finally) awarded the highest marks. This mare was the only one to win eight "20s", four for type and four for movement. Her final score of 93.00 points was the highest score in the show. Wildanova (WH Justice-Wilga / Gazal Al Shaqab) was right behind her with 91.7 points and one „20" for movement. In Class B, all six mares obtained over 90.00 points. Mares from private studs were in the lead. The first place with a score of 91.60 points (including one "20" for type and head and neck) was won by Evett Magic (S.M.A. Magic One-Evolett / Ajman Moniscione) bred by Katarzyna Dolińska-Witkowska, and owned by Tomasz Tarczyński. The second place went to Echo Astreria (Psyche Keret-Echo Aurora / Eternity Ibn Navarrone-D) bred/owned by Chrcynno-Palac Stud, who received 91.30 points.

The 7-10-year-old Mare Class was also divided into two sub - Classes. Prunella (Abyad AA - Pradera / Hlayyil Ramadan) was a strong accent in Class A, grey Prunella, who was born in Janów Podlaski and is owned by the Suweco Nina Suskevicova Stud, is fantastically female and moves flexibly. Well presented, she scored 92.00 points, including three "20s": one for type and two for movement. Janów's mare Adelita (Vitorio TO-Altamira / Ekstern) was also in second place, and the judges awarded her 91.20

points. The winning streak did not leave Janów Stud also in the 7-10-year-old Mare Class thanks to Patria (Eden C-Palmeta / Ecaho) who moved to the lead by scoring 90.40 points.

However, in the Championship, Janów mares were not strong enough to stay in the lead. The second place in this class went to Eksana (Eternity Ibn Navarrone-D-Espira / Psytadel) bred/owned by Lech Błaszczyk with a score of 90.10 points. Four ladies competed in the 11-year-old and older Mare Class for the title of the most beautiful. Michałów's Zigi Zana (QR Marc-Zagrobla / Monogramm) and Białka's Permaria (Esparto-Perolia / Gazal Al Shaqab) received the same score of 91.10 points, and the victory was determined by Zigi Zana's higher marks for the type. Arabian horse fans probably remember her mother - the phenomenal Zagrobla (Monogramm x Zguba / Enrilo), World Champion in Paris in 2000, who passed away in 2019 at the age of 25.

Sunday (14.08) The climax - Championships

After two days of struggle, the best of the best future Champions and Champions of Poland came to the ring. Due to weather conditions, the Sunday Championships were postponed from 9:15 to 11:30. Despite the delay, the Championships went smoothly. That day the sky over the Stud finally brightened up. Although the ground in the ring left much to be desired, the Championships could take place

outside. Fortunately! Especially because the raw and unprepared hall was not a suitable place for an event of such high importance.

The first to appear were the yearling fillies, a total of 9 young ladies, who were still somewhat lost in the show atmosphere. The bay Labonita from Michałów stood out from all the fillies. This filigree, but charming filly also caught the eye of the judges who awarded her with a gold medal and the title of Polish Yearling Filly Champion. The silver medal and the Vice Champion title went to Bella Rose bred/owned by Paweł Redestowicz, who entered the finals from second place in the Class. The judges awarded the bronze medal to Bella Mia from Janów, who also won the bronze medal at this year's Białka show. This mare definitely deserves a place on the podium and has a predisposition to stand even higher in the future. The fourth and fifth places belonged to Driada from Michałów and to the silver medalist of this year's show on Saturday - Eri Starra bred/owned by Petronisz Frejlich. There was not enough room for Wieża Uczuć who had the highest score in the yearling filly Class.

Nahil Al Khaladiah repeats the success and takes revenge for the show in Białka

The fight for the podium in the Yearling Colt Championship was between three horses that competed in the same Class on Friday, i.e. El Medar, Al Narciso and Elon KL. The

Michałów-bred El Medar did not give his friends a chance again, because he decided to repeat his success from the show in Białka and credited his account with another gold medal. On the podium, he was accompanied by Elon KL who won the title of Vice Champion and thus made his breeders and owners (Klikowa Arabians Stud) proud. The bronze medal was won by Janów's Al Narciso. The silver medalist from Białka, the Michałów-bred Delikt, was less lucky and came in fourth place, ahead of Foggiro, who was fifth in the finals.

The Junior Filly Championship was another double (!) triumph of the Michałów Stud. Morion's two daughters, already known from the show arenas, El Medida and El Mariella, outclassed their rivals, winning the gold medal and the Champion title, as well as the silver medal and the Vice Champion title, respectively. El Medida additionally expanded her collection of titles with the title of the Best Head of the Show and the Best in Show - Pure Polish title. The latter is an award granted by the Polish Arabian Horse Breeders Association. The bronze medal was won by last year's yearling filly Champion, the wonderful Bogini Róż PA (PPH Parys). Echo Anastazja from the Chrcynno-Pałac Stud with her beautiful head was fourth.

The title of Junior Colt Champion was unanimously won by Nahil Al Khalediah, representing the Stud from Nowe Wrońska, Polska AKF. This colt repeated his last year's success when he was awarded the title of Yearling Colt

Champion. Nahil Al Khalediah as the Junior Colt Champion also received a special Izabella Pawelec-Zawadzka award founded by Krzysztof Goździalski from Falborek Arabians. Right behind him, with the silver medal and the Vice Champion title, was his Class rival from Michałów - El Brillo. The rivalry between the stallions is fierce because at this year's show in Białka the situation on the podium was exactly the opposite. Moreover, Chicago won the bronze medal, and Wirton GA finished in fourth place.

Michałów Stud is not slowing down - El Esmera takes everything

Finally! The Senior Mare Championship, i.e. the Championship of the most beautiful of the beautiful, the ones with whom the heart always beats harder. The Senior Mare Championship has always aroused the greatest emotions, and the selection of Champions has not been an easy task for the judges.

It was the same this time when 10 doyennes of Polish breeding arrived in the ring. Without a doubt, Michałów's El Esmera stood out from her strong competition and won the Senior Mare Champion title. Therefore, Michałów Stud won the fourth gold medal. However, this is not the end, because El Esmera has expanded her collection of titles with special prizes and the Highest Scored Mare, Best Mover and Best Show titles. The silver medal was awarded by the judges to the grey Prunella, bred in Janów Podlaski, but

representing Suweco Stud. The bronze medal also went to a private breeder thanks to the mare Evett Magic bred by Katarzyna Dolińska-Witkowska / owned by Tomasz Tarczyński. The fourth and fifth places were reserved for the other Michałów mares, i.e. the excellent Wildanova and Zigi Zana.

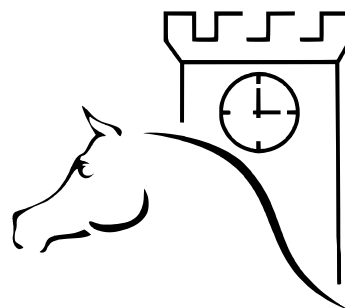
Senior Stallion Championship - Złoty Medal and Ptolemeusz connect generations

During the Senior Stallion Championship in the ring, which is rare, father and son competed together in the same competition. These were the Michałów stallions Złoty Medal and Ptolemeusz. Ptolemeusz emerged victorious from this duel, winning the silver medal and the title of Vice Champion. His father Złoty Medal came fourth, but he certainly should not be called a loser. The main goal of the stallion in breeding, and at the same time his greatest success, is to have a son who is better than him. The third place on the podium and a bronze medal were won by Ames JR bred/ owned by Janusz Ryżkowski. With a large majority of judges' votes, the gold medal and the title of Senior Stallion Champion were awarded to the well-prepared stallion Psyche Keret, representing the Chrcynno-Palac Stud.

When it comes to the special prizes, the title of Best Racehorse of the National Show was awarded to Janów's Adelita (Vitorio TO-Altamira / Ekstern). The mare did not

win any medal in the Championships, but in her Class of 7-10-year-olds, she was second with a score of 91.20 points. The WAHO Challenge Trophy awarded to an outstanding representative of Polish Arabian horse breeding was awarded to Zbigniew Górski's mare Almina (Furiat - Amina / Murat-Gazon). This year, there was also the Best Offspring of Ekstern Award which was given to the 4-year-old bay stallion Petrus PA (Piwonia by Karami) bred/ owned by PPH Parys. The epic stallion Ekstern (Monogramm-Ernestyna / Piechur), called the "King of Michałów" passed away in April this year.

Michałów Stud, apart from 4 gold and 3 silver medals, also won the title of the Best Breeder. Such a result comes from all the work and effort of the entire team, which was also appreciated because Paweł Sylwoniuk won the Best Trainer award and Artur Łojowski was awarded the Best Trainer prize.

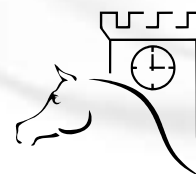

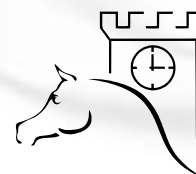

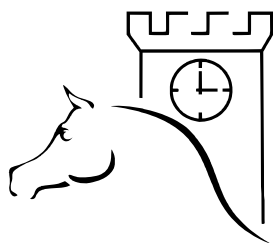

2022 Pride of Poland and Summer Sale

„Considering very difficult geopolitical and economic situation in the world - inflation, a pandemic and a war beyond Poland's Eastern border, as well as looking at the results of this year's Arabian horse auctions preceding the Pride of Poland, it was difficult to assume that the vast majority of horses would sell for such high amounts. However, we believed in the quality of our horses and in the intuition of the buyers as to the possibility of using them in the future, whether at shows or in breeding. As organisers we are satisfied not only with such a good financial result, but also with the large number of positive comments coming from our guests and participants of both events from home and abroad. What is more - we already have declarations of the first very good horses for next year's auction!” - Krzysztof Kierzek, president of the Polish Jockey Club PKWK, organizer.

The last chords of Mazurek Dąbrowski were still pounding in the ears, and the Championship emotions of success and defeat hovered in the air when the ring lit up with coloured lights announcing the start of the 53rd Pride of Poland Auction. The light colours were not random and each one had a different meaning. The red colour informed that the horse had not reached the reserve price, while the green colour indicated that such an amount had just been reached. On Sunday the weather was good and did not change until the end of the auction.

This year - another novelty, the organizers introduced the hybrid auction system, i.e. the buyers present in Janów Podlaski could participate in the auction as well as those who decided to participate online. Has such a solution resulted in greater customer interest in the auction?

“Approximately 40 'live' buyers and a dozen 'online' registered to take part in both auctions. The introduction of the hybrid auction this year definitely widened the pool of potential buyers to include those who could not afford to travel to Poland, which is particularly important in the era of the pandemic. The active participation of online buyers was particularly evident in the case of Monday's Summer Sale, where online bidders engaged in dynamic competition with customers at Janów Stud, which not only had a positive impact on the prices achieved, but also introduced an element of a kind of competition between 'in-home' and 'online' with an advantage of one or the other.” Explained Krzysztof Kierzek.

The catalogue list of the main auction included 21 horses with one of them withdrawn by the owner. So, we saw 14 mares and 4 stallions in the ring. 14 out of 20 horses exhibited by state studs and private breeders found a new home. The final result of the 5-hour auction on Sunday amounted to EUR 1,596,000. A French customer went on a shopping spree and stood out by bidding Lot.1, i.e. Białka's

mare Egira. Ultimately, the mare reached the amount of EUR 115k. It was just the beginning of the auction emotions because Lot. 4 and Lot. 5 had real stars, i.e. Michałów's Poganinka and Janów's Euzona. It was known from the very beginning that these mares would arouse great interest. Poganinka, full of charm and referred to in the catalogue as "the gem in the Pride of Poland Auction crown" holds, among others, the Title of Junior Filly Champion and Best in Show title from Bialka as well as the Champion and Vice Champion of the Al Khalediah European Arabian Horse Festival and the European Vice Champion titles.

In a nutshell, it is the highest quality Arabian mare that can be the base of the most serious breeding. The auction started

and at the amount of EUR 200k the lights went green and the auctioneer - Erik Blaak informed the participants - "She is on the market!". The offer proposed was 220k and this amount was the final one. It was similar in the case of the mare Euzona, who was bought by the same customer for the same price. This 11-year-old mare, whose list of titles is long, was offered for auction in foal to the stallion Prometeusz, the son of the unforgettable Pianissima. The real "bomb" of the auction turned out to be the daughter of two World Champions - the stallion QR Marc and Emandoria - Michałów's Esmeraldia, offered as Lot.7. Her price of EUR 400k was the highest in the auction. It is worth mentioning that Esmeraldia is the mother of El Esmera, who won the most important titles on Sunday.

The auction of the next horses had a much slower pace. Janów's Atakama (Lot. 9) and Michałów's Waranga (Lot. 14) reached the amount of EUR 175k and EUR 165k, respectively. Atakama, to the delight of the audience, will stay in Poland, and Waranga will leave for Sweden. Pogrom's daughter - Basilia (Lot. 19) from Janów, will also stay in Poland for EUR 30k. However, Michałów's El Mediara, was bought by a customer from the Netherlands for EUR 41k.

Three privately bred mares that added splendour to this year's auction list have found their homes in Lebanon (Etiffani, EUR 52k), Saudi Arabia (El Farida, EUR 34k) and in Israel (Gingera, EUR 27k). Four stallions also

participated in the auction, two of which - Kabsztad from Michałów and Czaro from Janów, changed their owners. The wonderful Kabsztad, the son of the Platinum World Champion and the record holder of sales at the Pride of Poland 2008 - EUR 1.125 million Kwestura, found his new home in Belgium at the Flaxman Arabians Stud. His auction ended at the amount of EUR 75k. However, Czaro was sold for EUR 30k and will live in the excellent stables of Halsdon Arabians Stud from Great Britain.

During the Monday Summer Sale auction, the most expensive horse sold was Michałów's Wieża Orientu - the daughter of the phenomenal Wieża Mocy - Polish Junior Filly Champion, European Champion, World Champion and

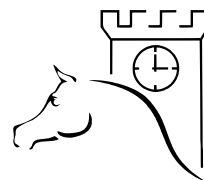

US Champion title holder. A customer from Belgium auctioned her for EUR 81k. A total of 19 horses out of 25 offered were sold. Ultimately, the Summer Sale auction ended with the result of EUR 402k. Thus, the total result of both auctions amounted to EUR 1,998,000.

Is the "new" the enemy of the "old"? "A horse is a culture", said Roman Pankiewicz, one of the greatest authorities in breeding Purebred Arabian horses. Culture, in turn, is most often described as the entirety of the achievements of society, passed down from generation to generation. Culture, therefore, includes traditions, values and knowledge. The Arabian Horse Festival, because this is how the show and the accompanying auction have been

described for years, has therefore not only breeding and economic aspects but also cultural overtones. Changes often seem good in theory, but not always in practice. They are needed because they lead to development. However, their implementation requires meticulousness, mindfulness and humility. It is worth taking care of what is "old", i.e. culture and tradition. After all, they – the old and the new- do not have to disturb one another.
