On the 14th till the 16th of June, the annual horse sport and show event in Westfalen took place at the Equestrian center in Lage, Germany. A nice intimate show were you can enjoy the various sport classes, the amateur show and the international c-show.

On Friday they started with the show jumping and on Saturday was a full program with dressage, trail classes, Freestyle classes and a caprilli test.

Best in show novice was won by MJ Wild Narciza (Profendor KA x MJ Cantress) bred and owned by Murillo and shown by Jessy Loockx from Belgium. The best in show amateur was for Kuna Asil (Kunar T x Poliana) – bred by the Kossack Stud and owned by shown by Jenny Pohl from Germany.

On Sunday the international C-show started with the 4-6 years old mares. Judges for this show were Mr Andy Letsch, Mrs Fayt, Mr Huet, Mrs Maxwell, Mr Schröder and Mr den Hartog.

In total 6 entries and the first place with 40.83 points went to Firediva (QR Marc x Flancee), bred by Pawel Redestowicz and owned by Flaxman Arabians from Belgium. Later in the championships, she took the golden medal. Second with 40 points was Nawari al Noor (Emerald J x Norah el Perseus) – bred and owned by VA Gestut Emaj from Switzerland. Later in the championships, she took the silver medal.

Next up were the mares 7-9 years old. Unfortunately only

one entry and therefor the classwin automatically went to Nakuna Kossack (Kunar T x Naomi C Kossack) with 38.50 points. Bred by the Kossack Stud and owned by Habibs Arabians from The Netherlands.

The class 10 years and older mares was won with 38.17 points by Al Chadim Gazia (Authentic ibn Nawaal x Al Chadim Ghazalla) – bred by Gestut Chrymont and owned by Michael Schmitz from Germany. Later in the championships she was awarded with the bronze medal.

Four stallions were entered in the class 4 years and older. Winner and later Gold medal champion and best in show winner with 41.33 points was Esfahan (Ekstern x El Fatha) – bred by Janow Podlaski stud and owned by Flaxman Arabians from Belgium. Second and silver medal champion with 89.83 points was MM Erasmo (RFI Farid x MM Estafania) – bred by Mario Matt and owned by Flaxman Arabians from Belgium.

The gelding class had two competitors and both scored the same total of 39.83 points. Winning on type was MM Esperado (RFI Farid x MM Eluise) – bred by Mario Matt and owned by Flaxman Arabians from Belgium.

After the lunch break it was time for the junior fillies! Five fillies aged 1-3 years old made there entrance. Winner and gold medal champion with 41 points was Flaxmans Pandora (MM Sergio x QR Sarah) – bred and owned by Flaxman Arabians. Second and silver medal winner with 40.33 points was Charisma Palazzotto (FA el Rasheem x Cicilla) – bred nad owned by Danubius Arabians from Romania.

A very strong class yearling colts was up next. Winner with a total of 41.17 points, the 2nd highest score of the day was ASE Farhan (RFI Farid x ASE Bisiriya Hlayyil) – bred and owned by Arabian Stud Europe from The Netherlands. This young promissing colt scored multiple 19,5's on type, head and neck and several 19s on movement. He was later

The next class and last class of the day was the one of the junior colts, aged 2 and 3 years old. Winner with 39.67 points was Turki al Soor (Sultan al Zobara x Tanqueray Bey) – bred by Abdullah Naser Alkhaldi and owned by Hassan Mubarak al Hindal. Later in the championships this colt took the bronze medal. Second with 39.17 points was Fulger DA (Empire x Formia) bred and owned by Danubius Arabians from Romania.

Best Straight Egyptian of the show was DG Soufian (Sahib x Bas Smah Elahiyah)

– bred by Dieter Gerbaulet and owned by KF Arabians from Germany.
