For the first time since 2006, the Tulip Cup International B-show is finally back on the show calendar! Being organized by Mrs. Jopie Smarius in 1997 for the very first time, the show still has the warm atmosphere and charisma. A favorite show to most trainers and participants! On the 7th and 8th of May 2011, the spectacular show took place and with almost 120 horses entered, it again made a strong foundation for the upcoming years! This time organized by the Kuijff family, Reisel family and Mrs. Smarius with Halsdon Arabians as the mainsponsor!



The judges privileged to judge this event where Mrs. Claudia Darius, Dr. Nasr Marei, Mrs. Marianne Tengsted and Mr. Jaroslav Lacina. The last one recently being voted as new president of ECAHO, The European Conference Arab Horse Organizations. The judges were assisted by the Kerstin Wisniewski as DC, who also did an excellent job during the weekend.

The show was being held at the beautiful facilities of 'Hippisch Centrum Deurne', one of the leading schools for horse management in Holland.

The show arena was beautifully decorated and there was enough space for all the spectators and also a well set vip area. There were several stands next to the arena with a big variety of products and talented artists. A real pleasure to see how creative people are when it comes to their greatest passion... the Arabian horse!

The show started on Saturday morning with a nice collection of filly foals. A big winner was the typey TS Shamiss. Sired by Shahim al Nakeeb and out of TS Halinaah. Later this foal

was named Gold Medal winner with the filly foals as well as supreme champion foal!

Second in the class was AF Nadjira. Sired by Durval and out of AF Nadjira. This filly also took the silver medal with the filly foals as well as Reserve supreme champion foal!

Third in class and also Bronze medal winner of the filly foals was Forelocks Yoli. Sired by Kais and out of Yody F.

The colt foals was also a fun class to watch. Won by Forelocks Ludo, by Yack F, out of Lanizjka. Also the Gold Medal winner. Second in class and Silver medal winner was AF Barack Alif by MM Sultan and out of Atalante.

Third and Bronze Medal winner with more than 20 points less than the Gold medal winner, was FH Spring. Sired by Dosator and out of Nadia FH.

The yearling fillies presented some high quality youngsters! A big class with 13 fillies, with the first 20's of the day!

Although two yearling fillies scored the same amazing 361 points, the winner of the class was the very typey Mahalya L Jamaal. Sired by Al Ayad and out of Mahity el Jamaal.

With the just as beautiful Feuer Nejla at the second place. Sired by Ajman Moniscione and out of Nerva bint Volga.

A third place in this strong class was for Yusriyyah. Sired by Monarcos DD. The Tulip Cup winner of 2005! Yusriyyah is out of the mare Yusra.



After this exciting class of yearling fillies, the show went on with the yearling colts. Less quality than the yearling fillies but for sure a great class to watch! Winner was the colt Peron. Sired by Esparto and out of Perolia. Second was the typey BK Latif by Nader el Jamal, out of the show champion Latifah AA. Third in this class was the Marajj son Taji. Coming out of Tatjana S.

Before going into the lunch break, it was time for the ridden classes.

Winner with the ridden class stallions and later also Champion of all ridden classes was the stallion Psymply Red DD. A son of the famous Psytadel. Winner with the ridden class of the mares was SR Soraya by Menesco MB.

After the break, the show continued with the 2 year old fillies. Again a big class of 13 fillies and again of very high quality. Convincingly won by the amazing Abha Sabiya. Sired by Marwan al Shaqab and out of Abha Galati.

A second place with just one point in difference, was the typey WW Indih. Sired by QR Marc and out of Ivernah. Third in this strong class was the beautiful black Awa. Sired by Vervaldee and out of Aziza.

The quality continued with the 2 years old colts. Again a big class and won by the typey Makisa Adaggio, who is by Vervaldee and out of Maradisha. A second place was for Maran, by FS Bengali out of Missouri.

Third in this class with the same score as number two, was Palermo DD. Sired by Justify and out of Lady Aymona DD.

Again the quality remained high in the class for the 3 years old fillies. Won by the very beautiful WH Justice daughter, El Piatzolla. Coming out of Enya. Closely followed with the same total of points, by Parmana. Sired by Al Maraam, out of Palmira. Both fillies had a score of 363 points! With just one point less, the filly Psyche Kreuzza, Ekstern x Pallas-Atena, came on the third place in this strong class.

The day ended with the class of the 3 years old colts. Won by the beautiful Marajj son, Sultan BVA, coming out of Ciara Bey. Second place was for AR Fayyim. Sired by Valerio ibn Eternity VI and out of Aicha SVA. Third in this class was DHS Waheeb el Nil. Sired by Imperial Kamill and out of Wardshah.

In the evening the show organizers planned a nice barbeque followed by a big breeders party that lasted till deep in the night! Nevertheless, most of the spectators were back in their seats in time for the first classes starting on Sunday.

The mares 4-6 years old were the first one of the morning to be presented. Won by the typey Rasheekha Sabha. Sired by Richteous and out of Tammens Ana.

Second with the same total score was the mare Fysio's Arabians Jaroharah. Sired by Rih al Tariq and out of Shatia. The third place in this class was for Alia Lahab RSA. Sired by Al Lahab, out of Alia Valentino.

The next class of the 4 - 6 years old colts only underlined the quality being presented at this Tulip Cup.. Winner was the always moving Ali Moniscione. Sired by Psytadel and out of Alianna Moniscione. The extremely beautiful Monther el Nasser was placed second. Sired by the great producer Ansata Hejazi and out of Aliah al Nasser. A third position was for the

Next class coming up was for the big moving stallion of 7-9 years old. Easily won by the great Master Design. A son of the legendary Versace and out of BEA Society Bell. Runner up was Hafid Ali el Dahab. Sired by MA Alishah and out of KEN Alia.

Third in this class was Adriann el Bri. Sired by CH el Brillo and out of LM Alisha.

The class of the senior mares of 10 years and older was a real treat. Won by the very beautiful SF Shaklina. Sired by

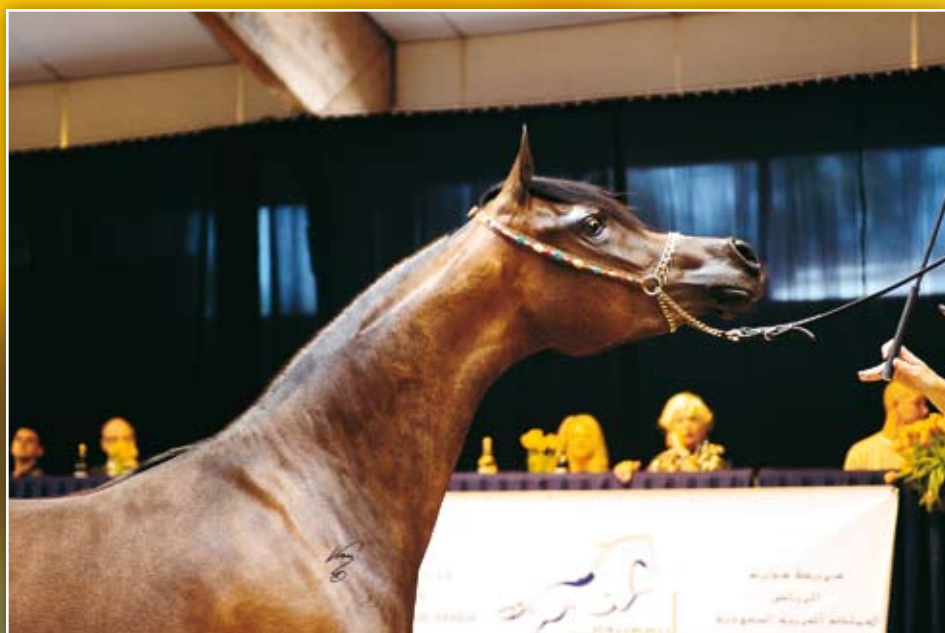

Gold medal winner junior fillies was EL Piatzolla, with the beautiful Abha Sabiya as Silver medal winner. A bronze medal was for WW Indih.

The Junior championships were won by Makisa Adaggio. A silver medal for Sultan BVA with a Bronze medal for Maran. In the senior mare championships, the gold medal went to the very beautiful Disputa FA. With saving the Silver medal for SF Shaklina. Bronze medal was for Rasheekha Sabha.

The final championship was for the Senior stallions. Won by Ali Moniscione.

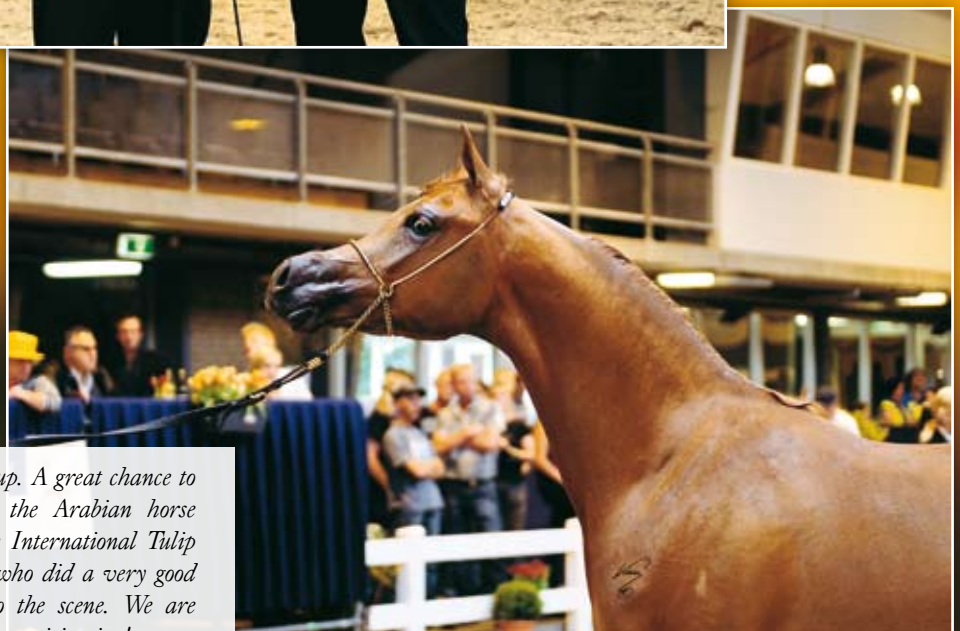
Silver medal was for Monther el Nasser with the Bronze medal being given to Master Design GA!

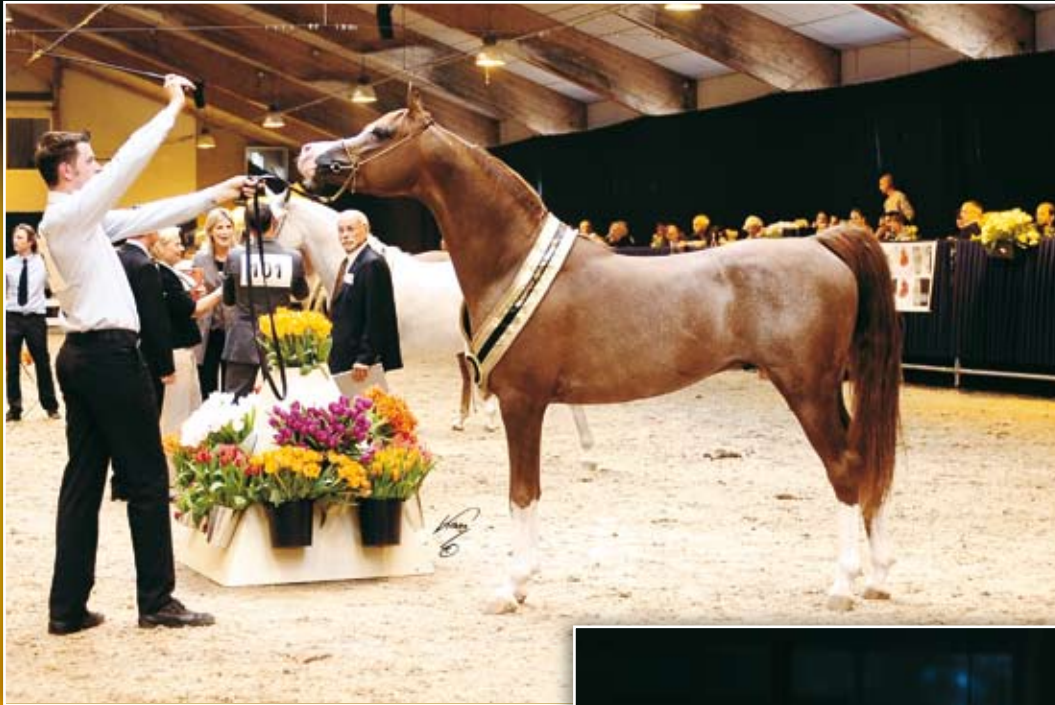
