Geraldyne El Jamaal (Ali Jamaal x Gai Natasha)

Born in 2002 on Lenita Peroy's Haras Meia Lua farm in Brazil, Geraldyne was a daughter of the illustrious Ali Jamaal and the lovely Bey Shah daughter, Gai Natasha. As a young mare, Geraldyne was purchased by Haras Serondella and later resold to Haras Stigmatas, in foal to Henno Serondella, which resulted in the beautiful black filly, Stig Josephine.

Meanwhile, in the Netherlands, a young woman named Talitha Bakker had been dreaming of owning a bay daughter of Ali Jamaal since she was sixteen. It was a dream she thought would never come true. In 2011, Talitha received a phone call that changed everything. Haras Stigmatas was closing, and all the horses were going up for auction, including Geraldyne el Jamaal. Without hesitation, Talitha flew to São Paulo, where she met Geraldyne for

the first time, marking the beginning of a remarkable journey.

Shortly after Talitha purchased Geraldyne, the border between Brazil and Europe closed, and Geraldyne tested positive for piroplasmosis, preventing her from leaving Brazil through the United States. For four long years, Talitha made desperate attempts to bring Geraldyne to Europe. Finally, an opportunity arose to export her from Uruguay. Geraldyne made the long trip to Uruguay and, after a few months, continued her journey to Europe and to Talitha's farm, her final destination.

Once in Europe, Geraldyne needed time to adapt, especially to the changing seasons. Talitha began training her under saddle, and although Geraldyne was already fifteen and had never been ridden, she soon proved to be an exceptional riding horse. During her pregnancies, Talitha and Geraldyne spent countless hours together, riding through forests and especially loving the mountains. Geraldyne became a successful broodmare, producing remarkable offspring. One of her most notable foals was Qamar al Jood, who was produced while being on lease to Al Jood Stud. Qamar went on to win many gold medals, including Unanimous Gold champion filly in Silleda Semana Verde and again at the Equigal International show

In 2019, Geraldyne had a difficult delivery, giving birth to a stunning black colt named ASE Justice el Jamaal by WH Justice. Talitha decided this would be Geraldyne's



last natural foal to ensure her health. Geraldyne continued to produce exceptional foals through embryo transfer, including her last foal, MJ Lady Godiva, by El Jahez WH from MJ Arabians, Denmark.

With Geraldyne no longer carrying foals herself, Talitha decided to pursue a new adventure: endurance riding. At the age of eighteen, Geraldyne began a successful endurance career, showcasing her incredible stamina and low heart rate. Talitha and Geraldyne competed in various endurance events, most of the time riding

completely alone, far from the other competitors, creating a deep bond and understanding between them. Geraldyne's intelligence and spirit made her a natural in the sport, and she became one of the most successful endurance horses of her age.

In 2023, at the age of twenty-two, Talitha and Geraldyne completed their final endurance ride together, finishing the grueling 289km race of the Schwäbische Alb in five days. Geraldyne was honored by the Dutch studbook for her outstanding endurance performances, receiving the Endurance Certificate of Honor and a prize for riding the third-most kilometers of all endurance horses in the Netherlands that year.

In the winter of 2023-2024, Talitha and Geraldyne began training for a new season. Geraldyne was still fit and ready to continue her endurance career. Sadly, in late February, Geraldyne suffered severe colic. Despite emergency surgery, complications from a previous operation meant there was no way to save her. Geraldyne was peacefully let go.

For Talitha, losing Geraldyne was like losing a best friend and soulmate. To the Arabian horse world, it was the loss of an icon, a true ambassador of the breed. Messages of condolences poured in from around the globe, many sharing how Geraldyne inspired them to ride their horses again or to start training their older broodmares under saddle. One young girl wrote to Talitha, saying, "I didn't think my horse could still compete at a high level at seventeen. Seeing you and Geraldyne competing at such tough endurance races at twenty-two, I decided to give it a go. Now, at eighteen, my horse is in top condition, and we're doing our first international endurance race of 100km next month!"

Geraldyne's journey from Brazil to the Netherlands, her achievements as an endurance horse, and her incredible offspring have left an indelible mark on many lives. Geraldyne el Jamaal will be remembered and honored forever, a true testament to the power of dreams and the enduring bond between horse and rider. •
