Although he hasn't been raised amongst Arabian horses, they fulfilled his whole life. Nowadays Rory O'Neill is Director of the Arabian Horse Association of Arizona, one of the most recognized Arabian horse trainers in USA getting popular also as a speaker and being often seen outside the country exploring Arabian horse breed, history and culture of other regions. In the talk with Urszula Leczycka he tells about the story of his experience, his passions for the breed and the new, interesting plans for the upcoming months...

Tutto Arabi: Before starting the history of O'Neill Arabians training center located in Arizona you have come a long way and interesting places you worked at...

Rory O'Neill: I started in the Arabian horse industry in the early 1980"s. I was raised in Northern California's wine country, At the time we were surrounded by numerous Arabian breeders and training centers. Stallions such as Bey Shah, Fame VF, *Padron, *Serafix, *Karadjordge and Fardjur, all standing within 2 hours of my home. My family was not a horse family but I was drawn in by my neighbors Arabians. From the daily experiences at the Arabian horse farm near to my house I spent nearly everyday after school and weekends learning, working and caring for horses! It was dirty, hard work, bad pay and... I wanted more! The horse shows in this era as I reflect back upon were amazing. Huge numbers in each class, less classes then we have now. Each breeder had a certain 'look' to their 'program'. I began showing Arabians at 8 years old and continued thru high school, age 18. After High School, I decided to take a break from full time horses to pursue College, snow skiing and track and field competition. After a 2 year hiatus, I needed to be with the Arabian horse again. I really missed the people and the horses. More or less I have committed to the Arabian horse business as a full time career for over 20 years professionally and nearly 30 years as a caretaker of these great animals.

TA: Who was your Arabian horse training master at your beginnings and do you have any now?

RO: Over the years I have been privileged to work with or for some truly special Horseman, such as Rob Bick, Murril Lacey, Ray LaCroix and Ted Carson. Each of theses 'mentors' pushed me hard daily, but saw potential for me to become a serious horseman. Throughout the years I have out worked many of my peers who I grew up in the 'business' with. This relentless work ethic has allowed doors of opportunity to open. I'm very grateful for the people I have worked under in the past, too many to list, who have gone to great lengths to share with me all their extensive experiences and knowledge.

TA: And the most significant horses you had an opportunity to work with before and while O'Neill Arabians has started were...?

RO: Amelia B (Magnum Psyche x Amety B) 2002 U.S. National Champion Yearling Filly, is a classic Arabian mare. Each day for the last 10 years I've been lucky to care for her and assist in her breeding decisions. It's been a fun ride and she has produced so well and created wealth for her owner, Lazy B Arabians, LLC. Amelia B is my all-time favorite Arabian! So beautiful.

TA: Together with your wife- Suzanne who is a accomplished saddle performance Amateur competitor, you offer what particular services to clients of O'Neill Arabians?

The Scottsdale Show and our Arabian Breeder's Finals Show in October are nothing short of hard work, strategic planning and risk taking. TA: You are also very frequent visitor outside USA, in which countries you like to travel the most and why?


